I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in the Republic of Congo perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *General Issues Facing the Republic of Congo*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results*
- *The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *Working with the World Bank Group*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in the Republic of Congo*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From May to July 2018, 400 stakeholders of the WBG in the Republic of Congo were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG supported projects/programs; local government; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs and community based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the judiciary branch; and other organizations.

A total of 326 stakeholders participated in the survey (82% response rate). Respondents received the questionnaires via courier or completed the questionnaires with a representative from the local fielding agency.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'15 (response rate was 72%, N=265). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'15 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in appendices A, B, C, D, and F. For the weighted stakeholder breakdown and year comparison results, please refer to Appendix E (page 104).

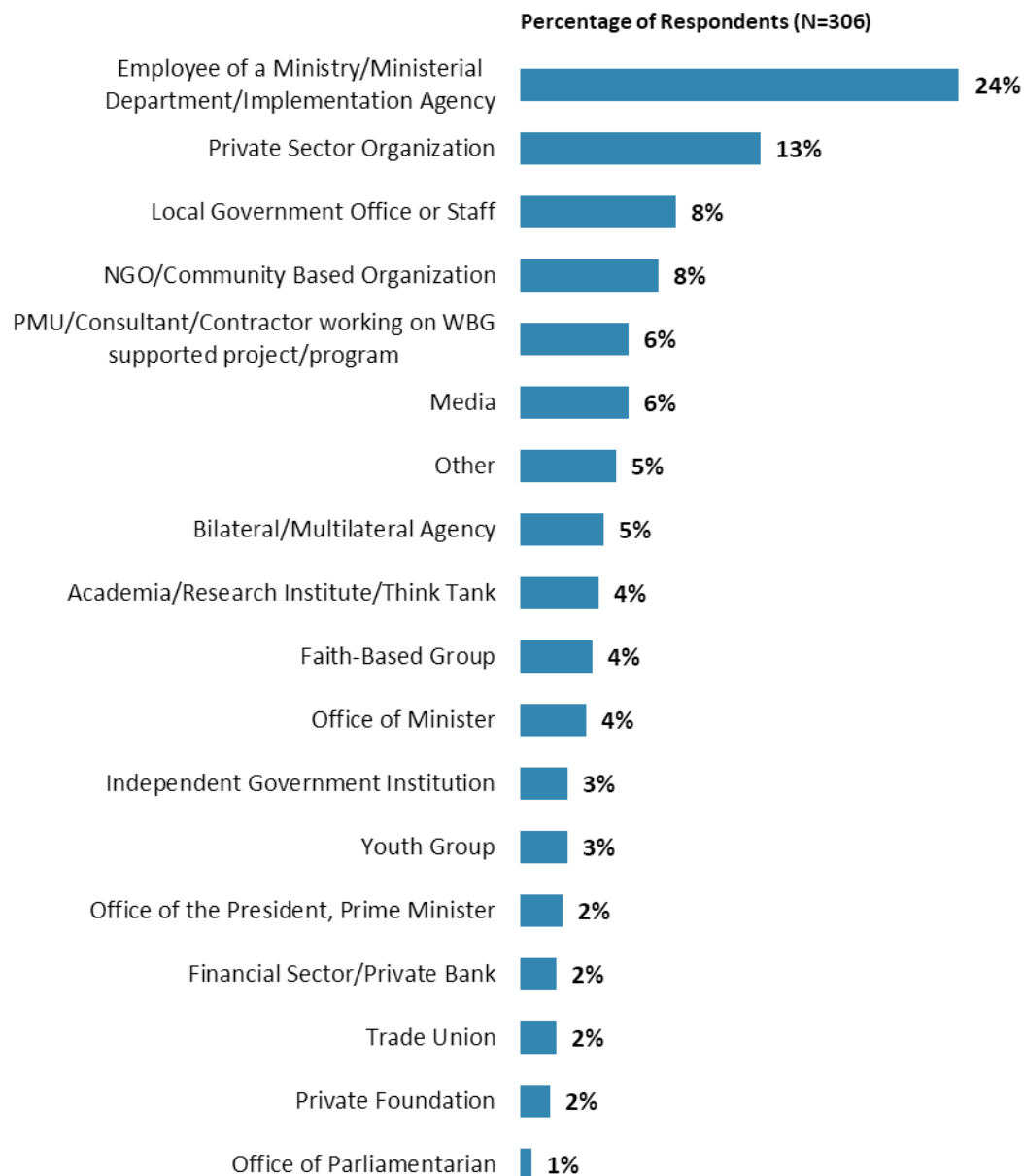

III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

- For further analyses, respondents from the Office of the President, Prime Minister and the office of a minister were combined; respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations; respondents from NGOs/community based organizations, private foundations, trade unions, faith-based groups and youth groups were combined in the “CSO” category; and the small number of respondents from the office of a parliamentarian and independent government institutions were included in the “Other” category. There were no respondents from the judiciary branch.

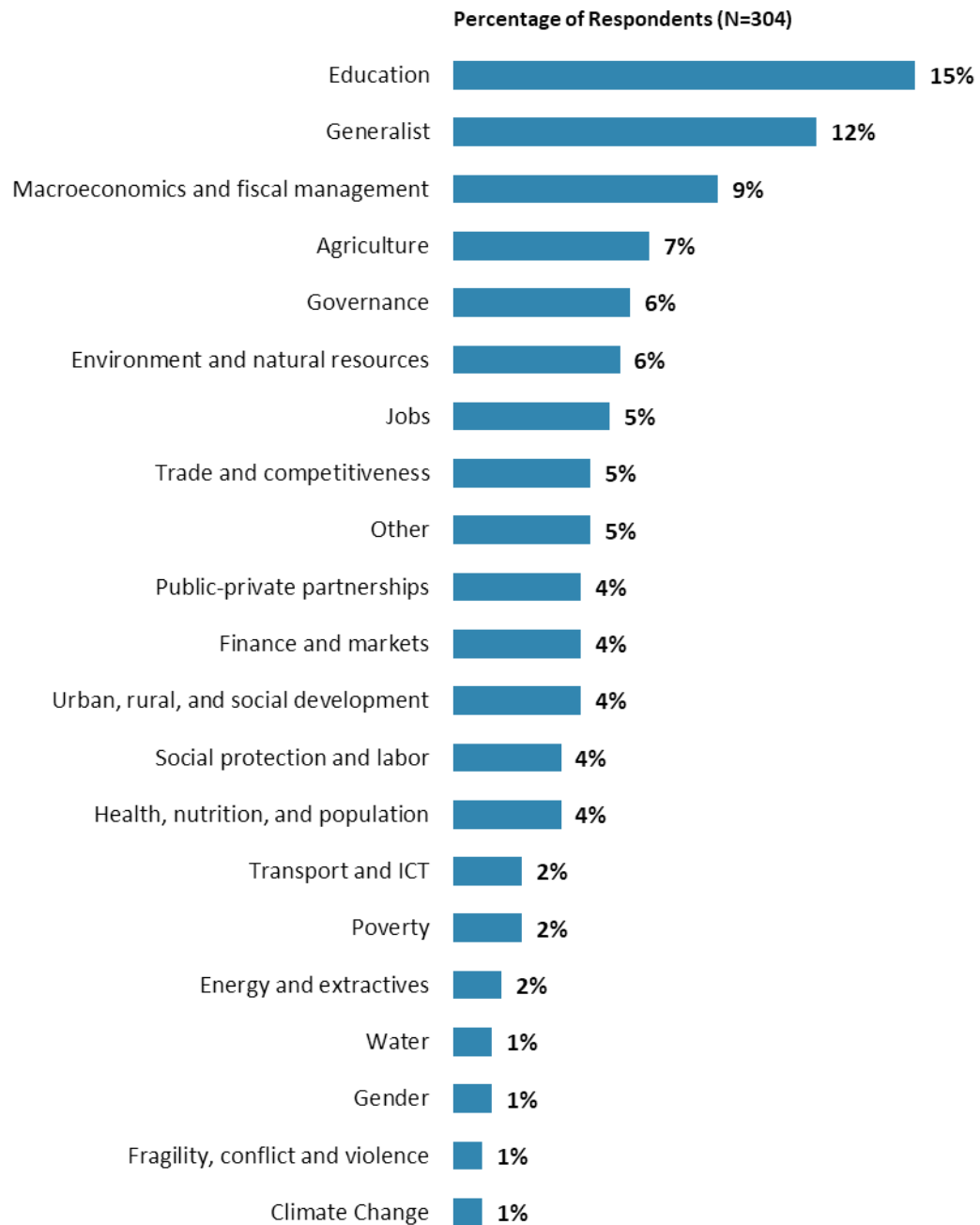


“Which of the following best describes your current position?”

Area of Primary Specialization



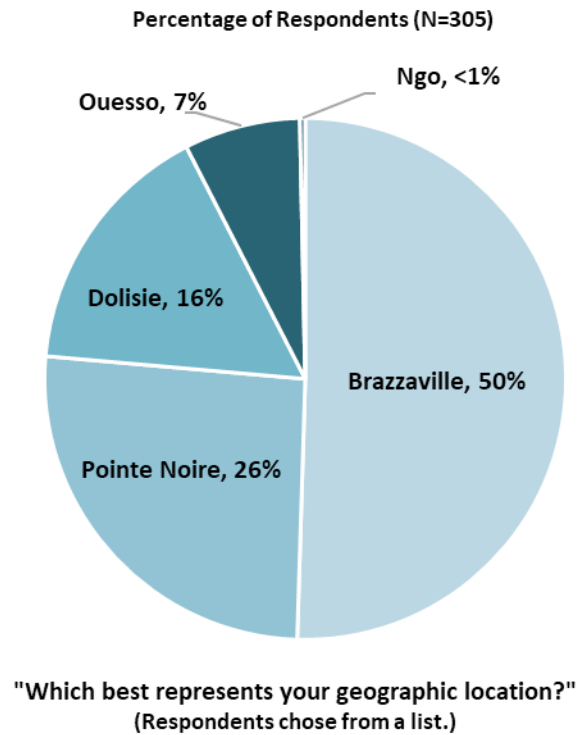
"Please identify the primary specialization of your work."

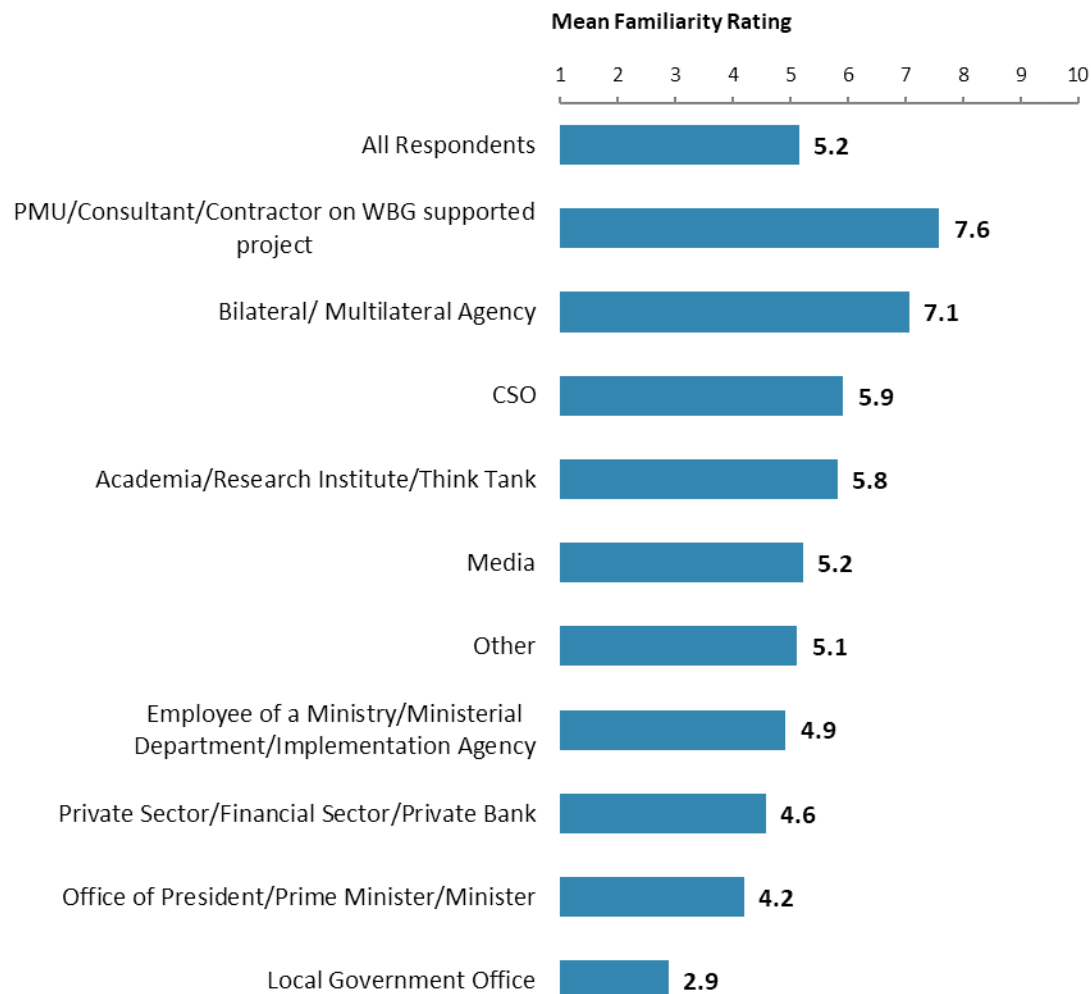




III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey and the FY'15 Country Survey had statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WBG (weighted mean in FY'18 = 5.2; weighted mean in FY'15 = 4.9)¹.
- Respondents' levels of familiarity with the WBG were significantly correlated with their ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness in the Republic of Congo, and with their ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in the Republic of Congo.

(1-"Not familiar at all", 10-"Extremely familiar")

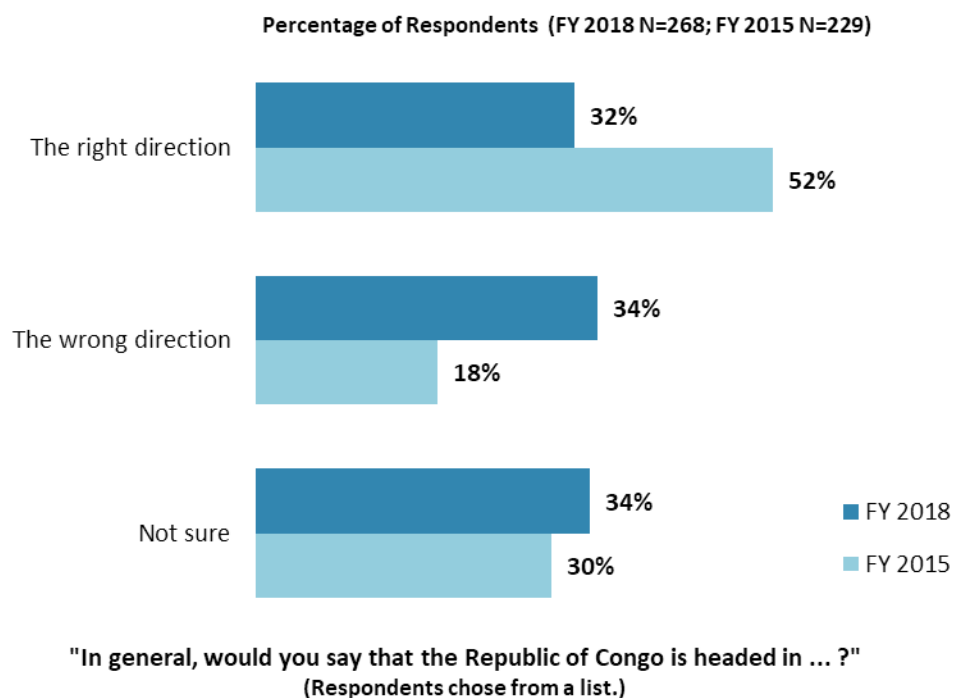

IV. General Issues Facing the Republic of Congo

Headed in the Right Direction²

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey were significantly less positive about the prospects of the Republic of Congo compared to respondents in the FY'15 Country Survey.
- **Stakeholder groups:** In this year's Country Survey, respondents from the Office of the President/Prime Minister/Minister, private sector and local government were significantly more likely to indicate that the Republic of Congo is headed in the wrong direction, while respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies and CSO were significantly more positive about the prospects of the Republic of Congo.



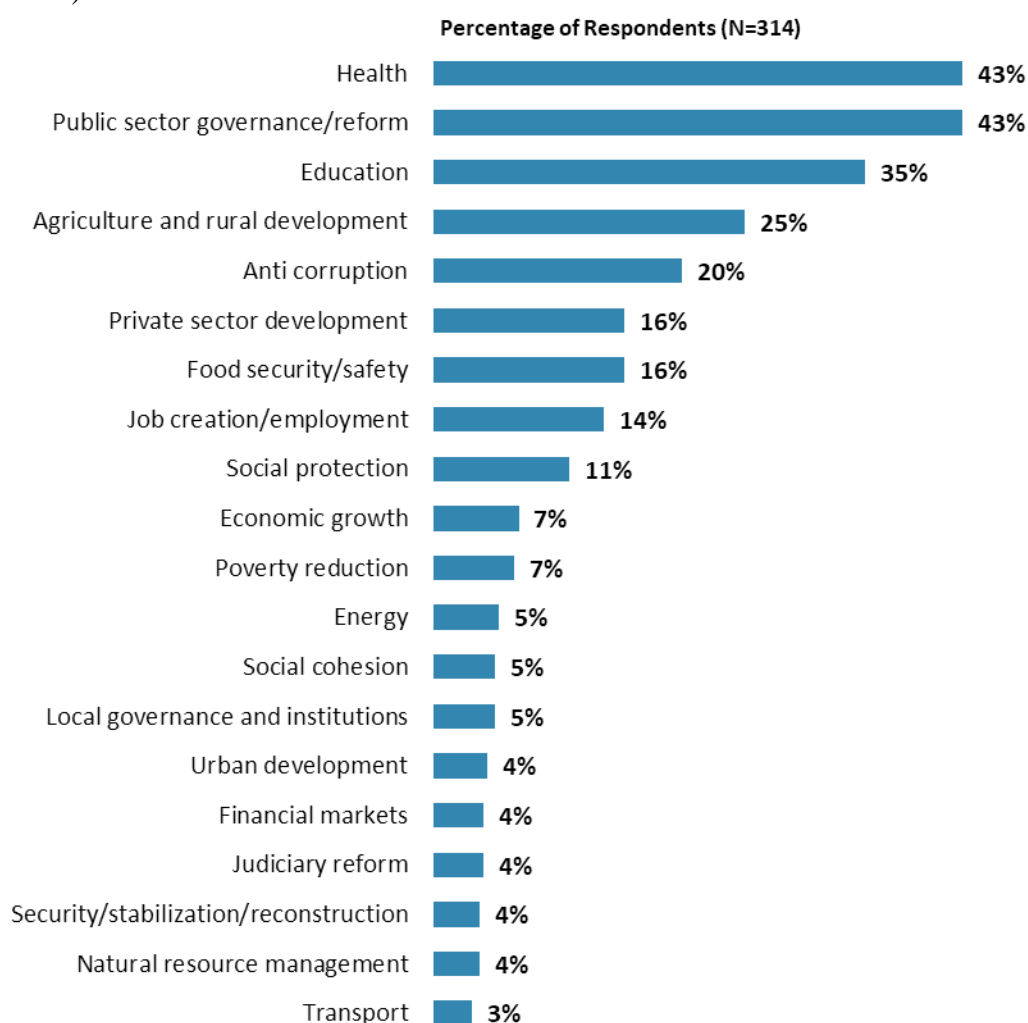

IV. General Issues Facing the Republic of Congo (continued)

Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'15 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priorities in the Republic of Congo were “*public sector governance/reform*” (47%), “*education*” (27%), “*food security*” (23%), “*poverty reduction*” (22%), “*health*” (21%), and “*economic growth*” (21%).
- **Specialization:** Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as “*education*” (15% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that “*education*” was the most important development priority in the Republic of Congo, compared to the rest of respondents in other areas of work (education specialists = 59%; others = 31%).

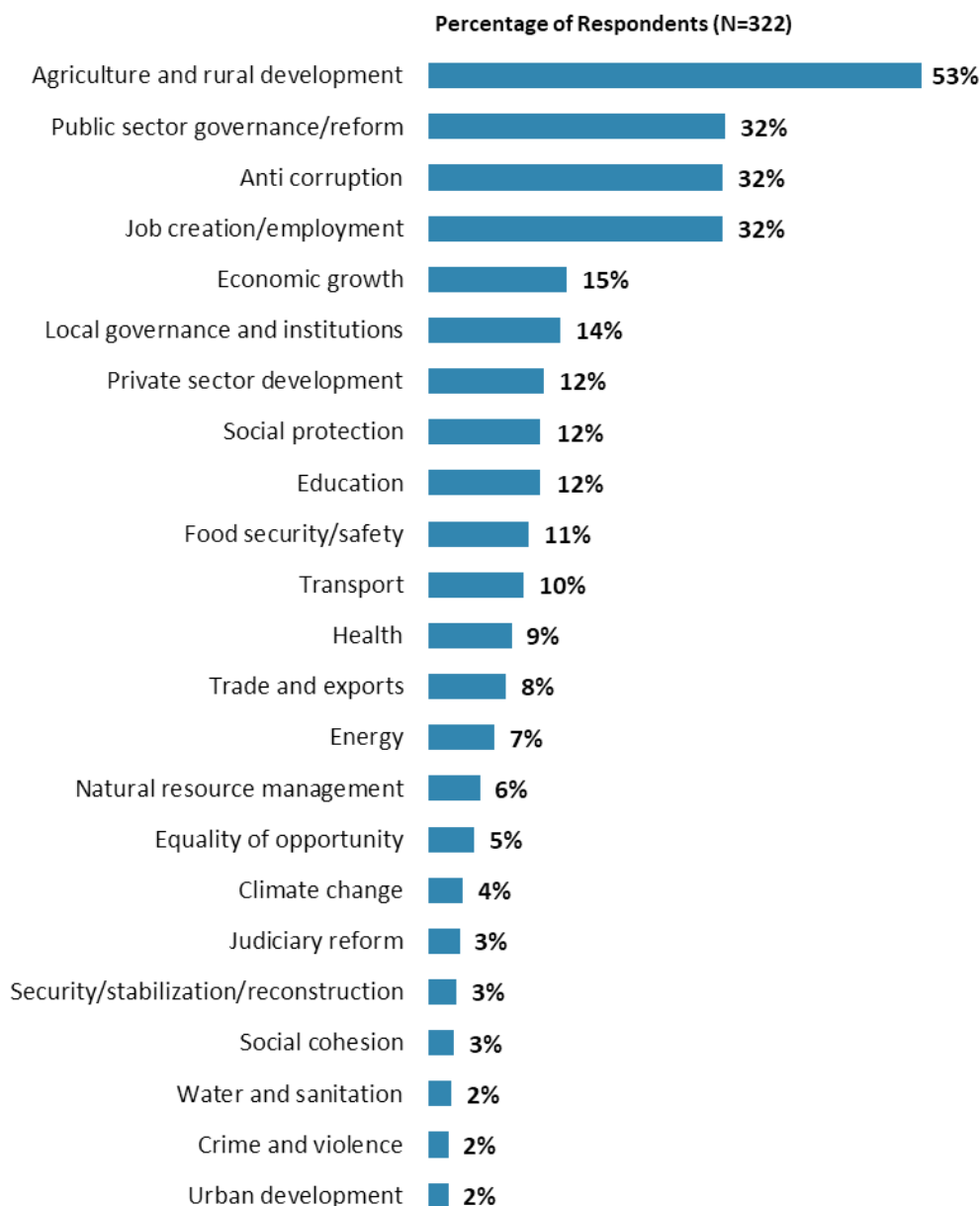

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'15 Country Survey indicated that the biggest contributors to poverty reduction in the Republic of Congo were “*economic growth*” (40%), “*public sector governance/reform*” (27%), “*agricultural development*” (24%), and “*job creation/employment*” (22%).

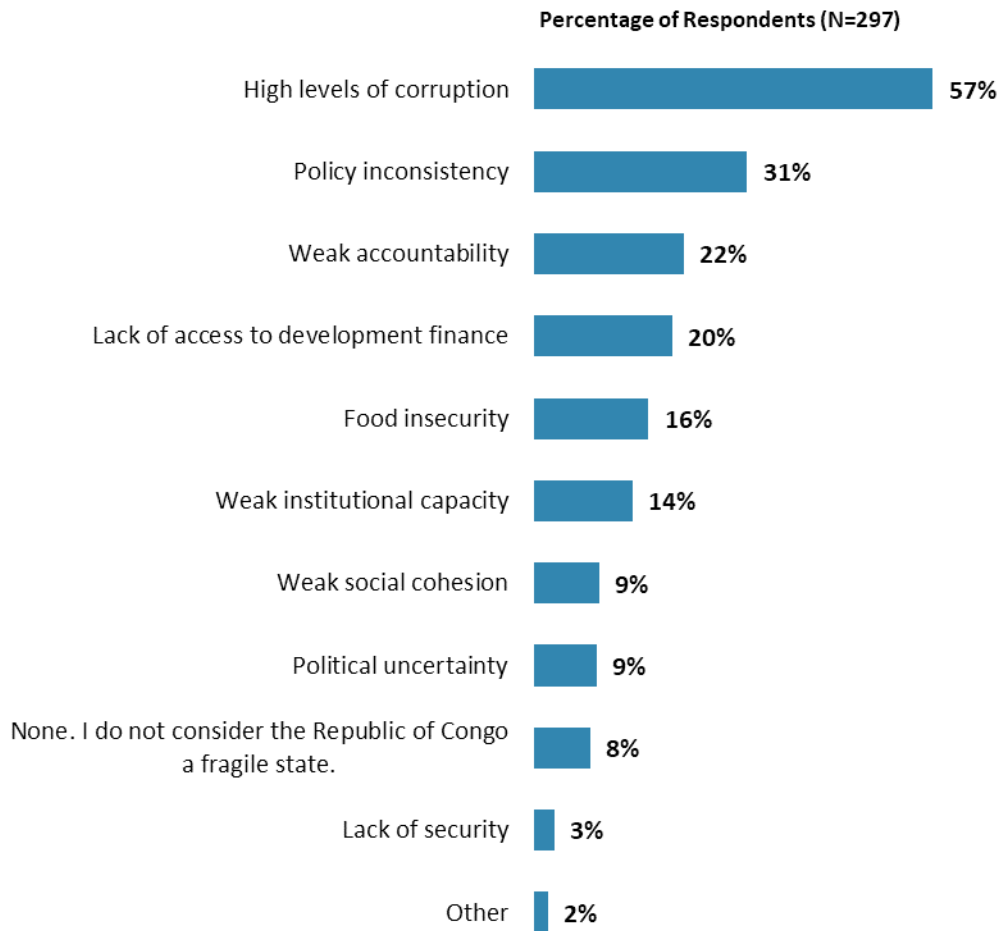

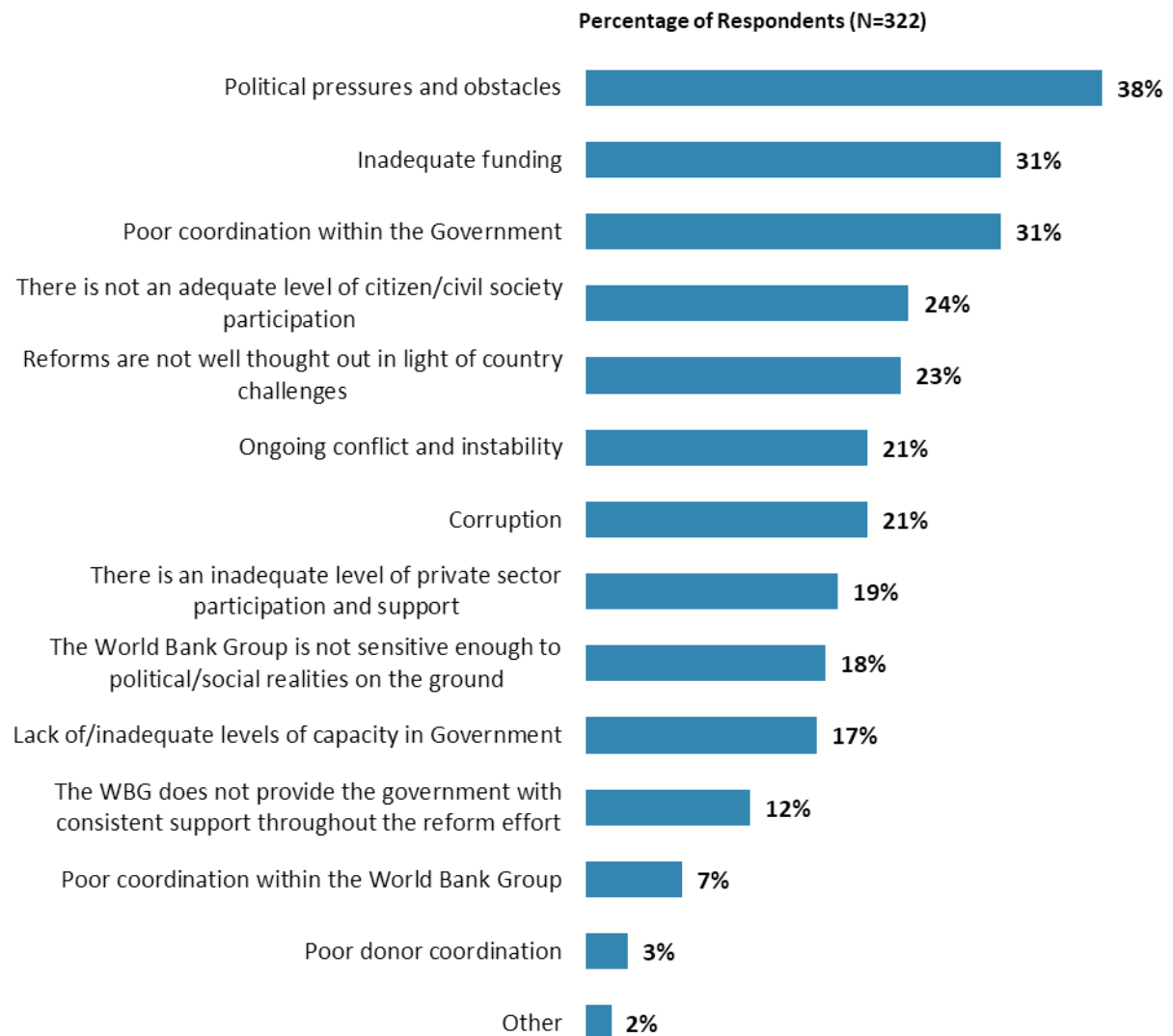

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group

Attributing Failed/Slow Reform Efforts

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'15 Country Survey most often attributed failed or slow WBG assisted reform efforts to that *“there is not an adequate level of citizen/civil society participation”* (52%), that *“the World Bank Group is not sensitive enough to political/social realities on the ground”* (34%), that *“the World Bank Group does not do adequate follow through/follow-up”* (33%), and to *“political pressures and obstacles”* (33%).

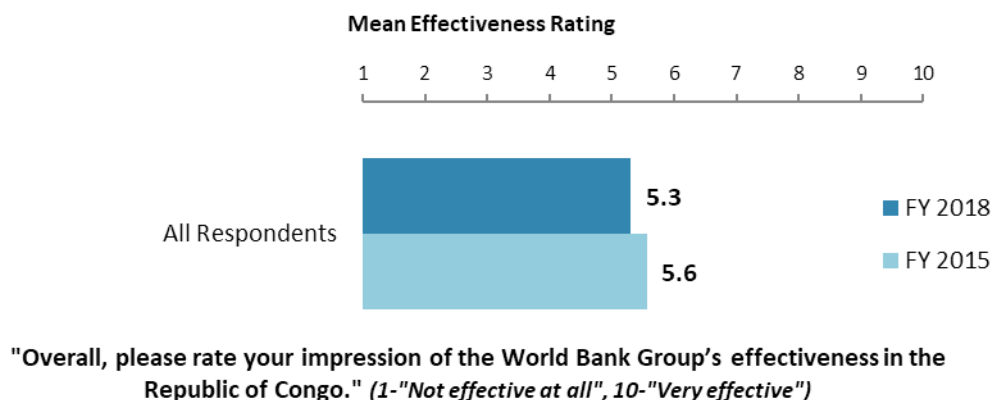

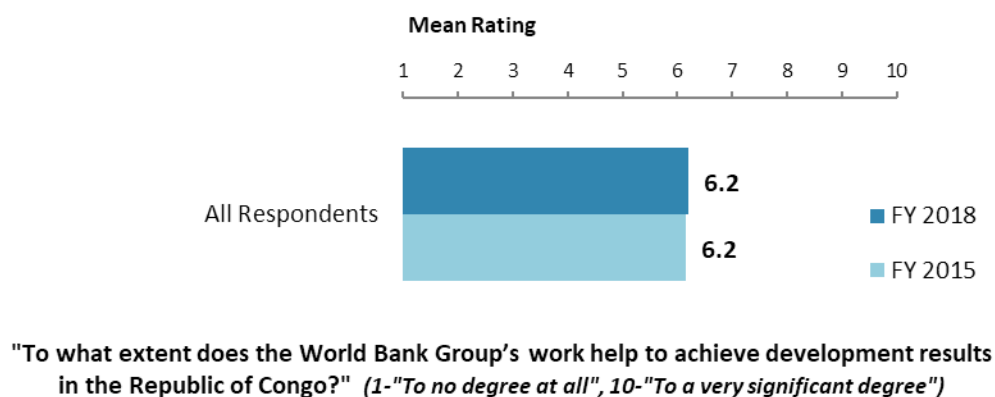

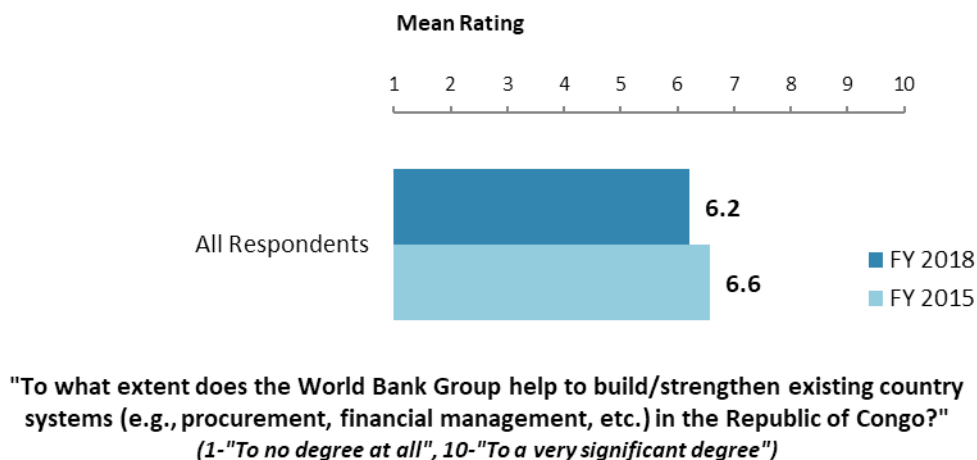
The World Bank Group's Overall Effectiveness³ (*Indicator Question*)

Building/Strengthening Existing Country Systems (*Indicator Question*)

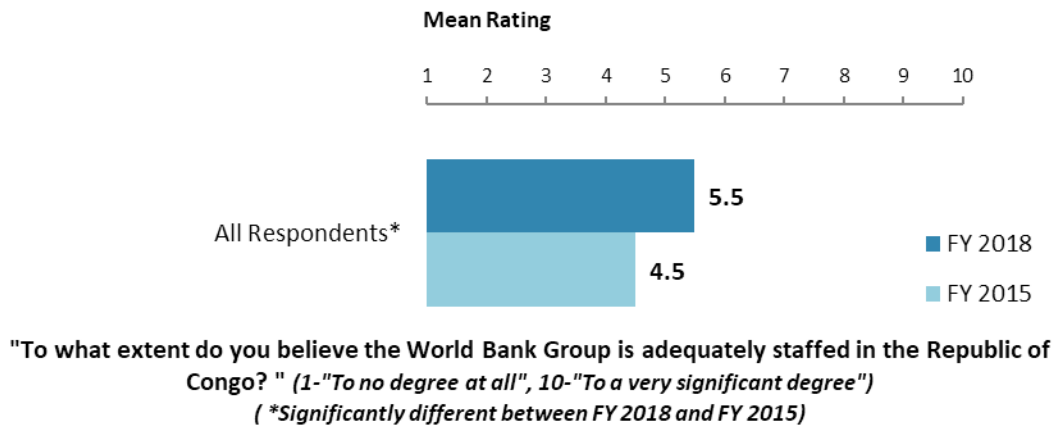

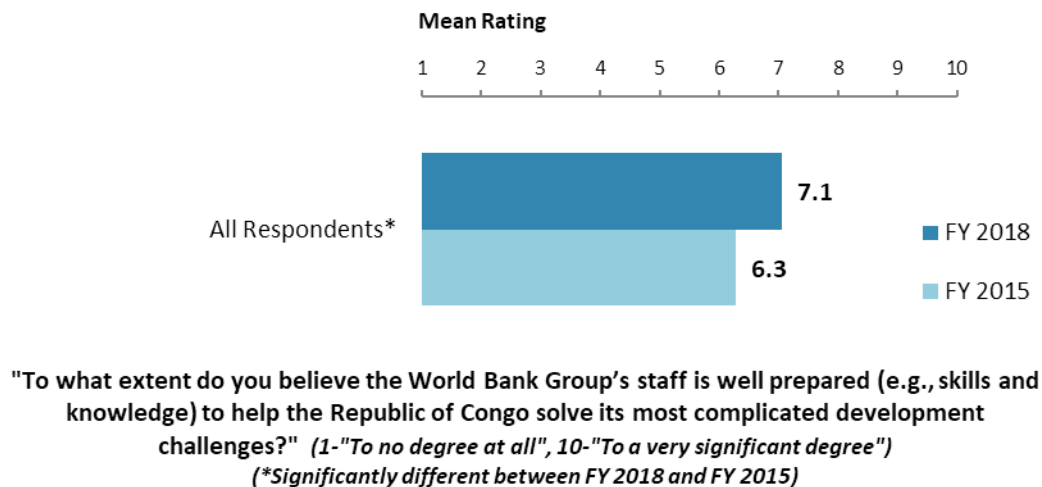

The WBG Staff Preparedness

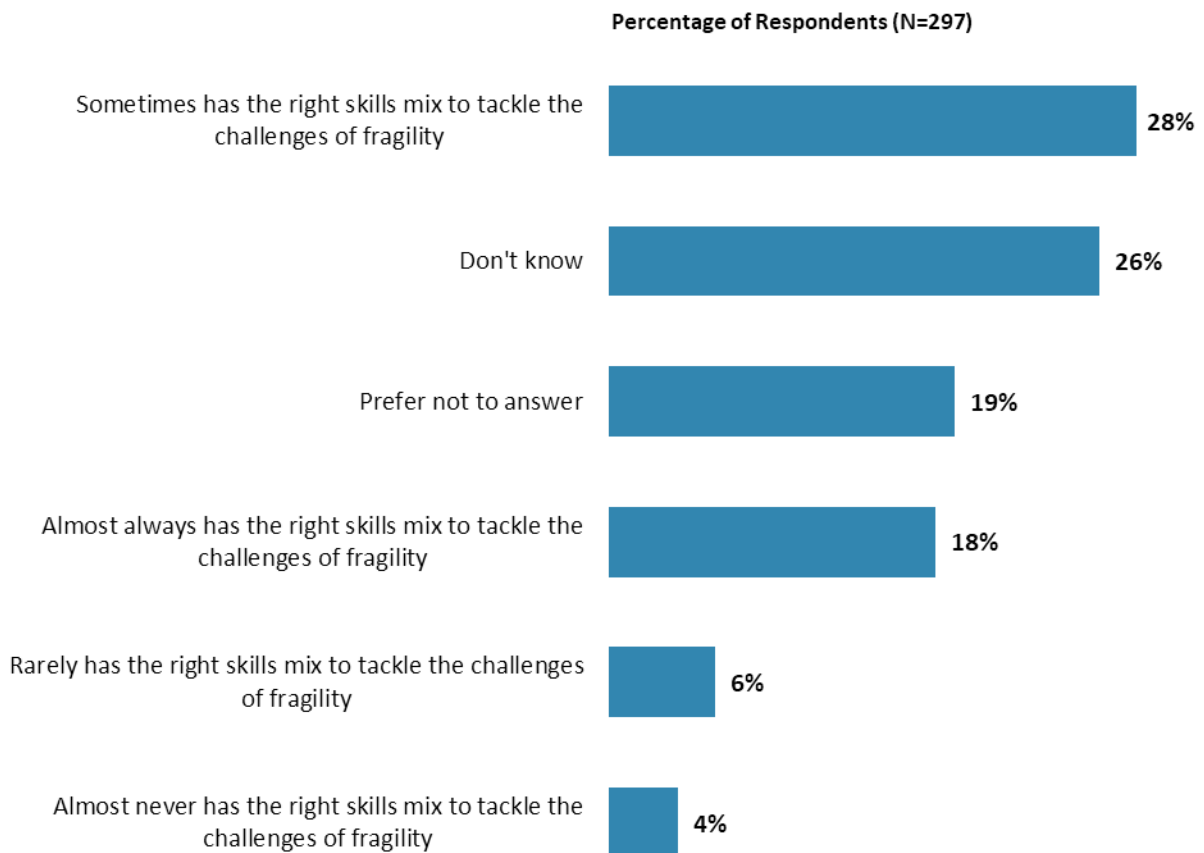

The WBG Staff's Skills Mix to Tackle Fragility



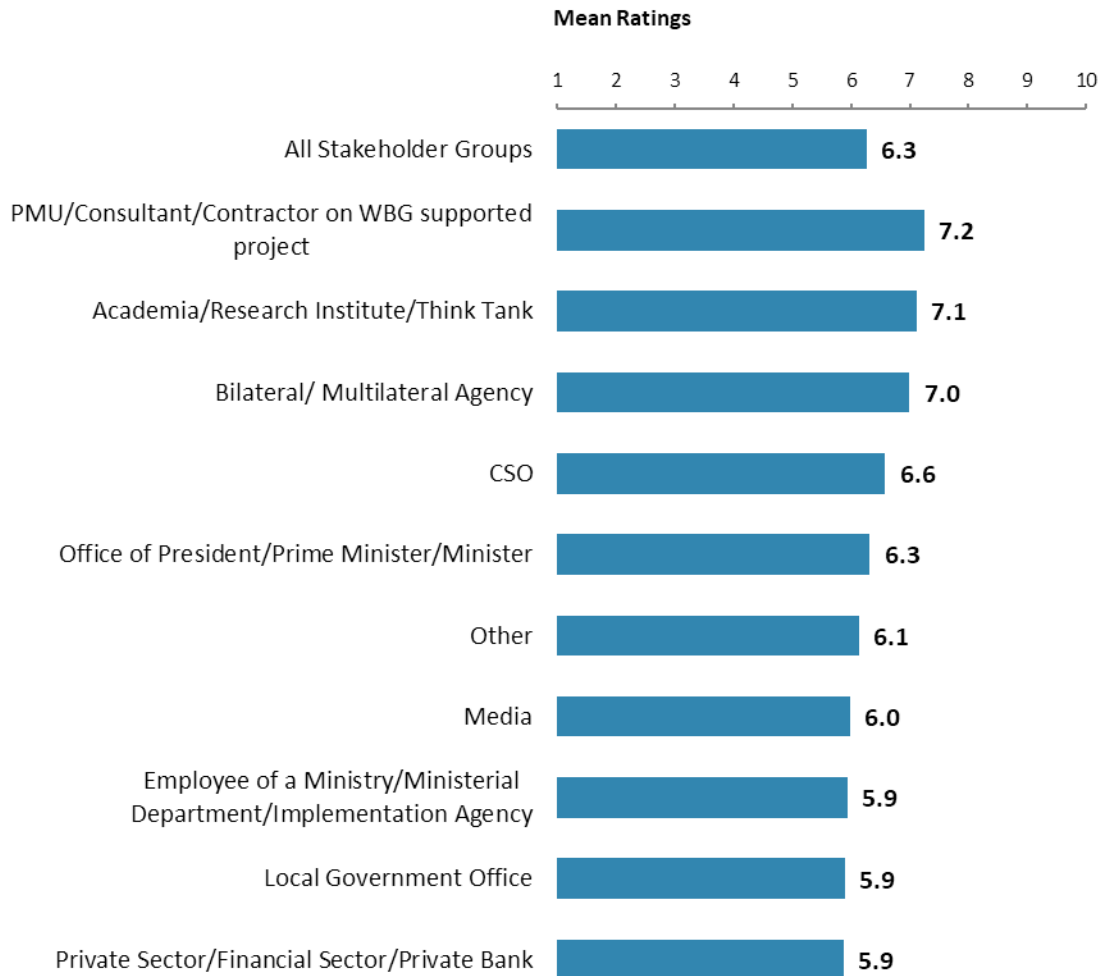
"When working with the World Bank Group on programs, projects and other activities, do you believe that the team ... ?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.0) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.8). 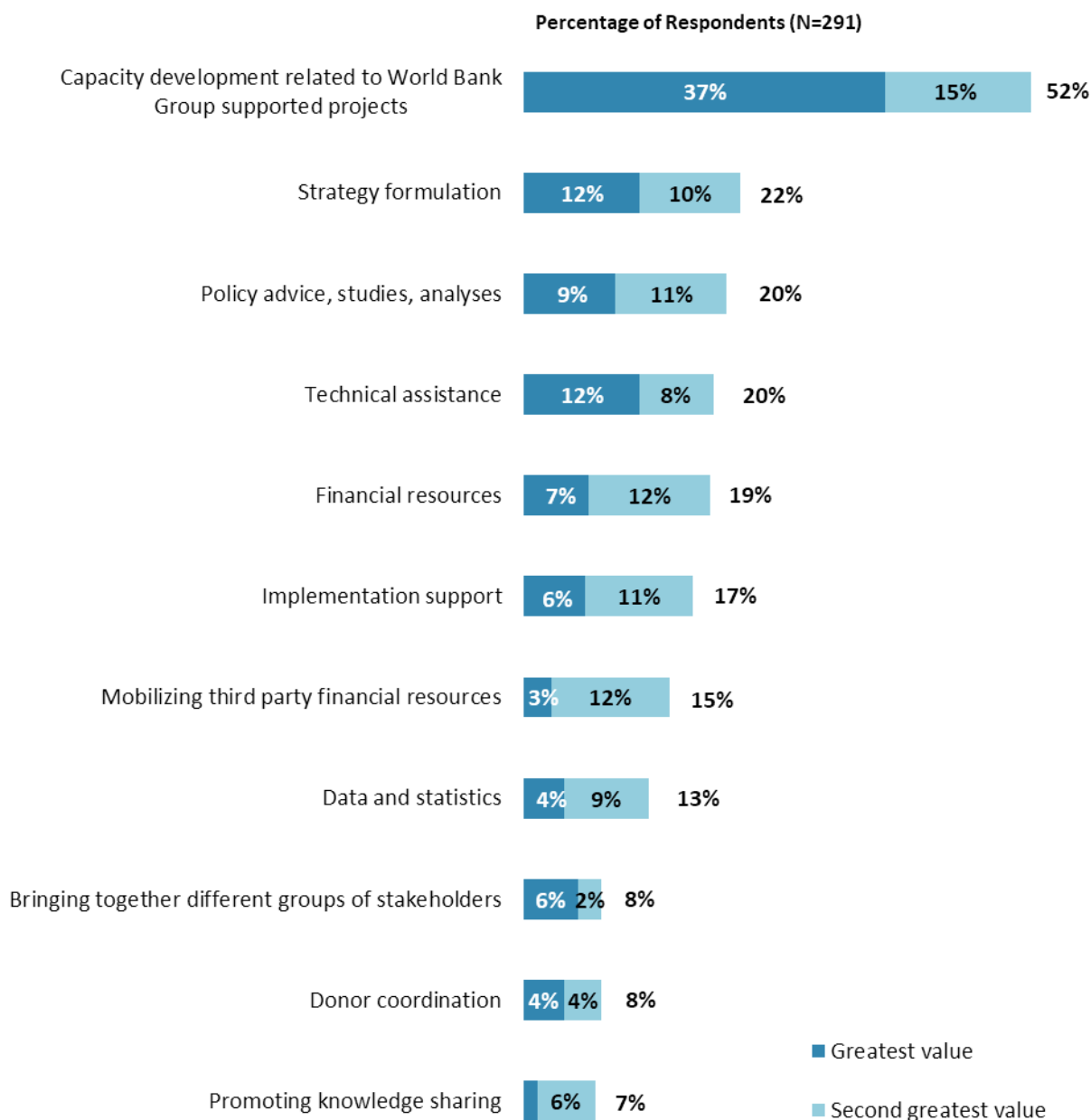
Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'15 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest values to the Republic of Congo were "*strategy formulation*" (42%), "*capacity development*" (36%), and "*policy advice, studies, analyses*" (30%).



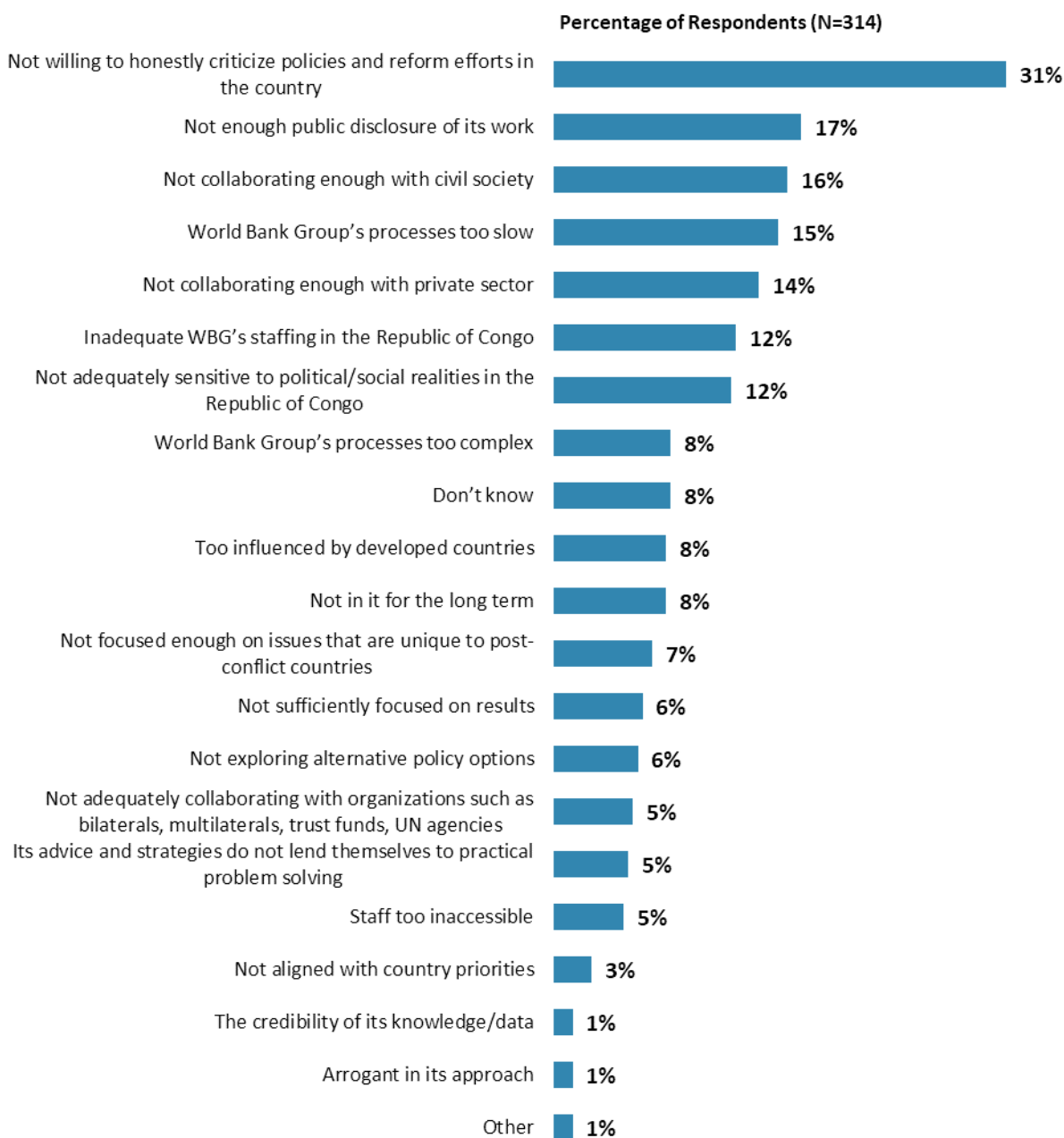
"When thinking about the World Bank Group's role, which activity do you believe is of greatest VALUE and which activity is of second greatest value in the Republic of Congo?"

Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'15 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses in its work in the Republic of Congo were "*not collaborating enough with stakeholders outside the Government*" (25%) and that "*World Bank Group's processes too complex*" (24%).

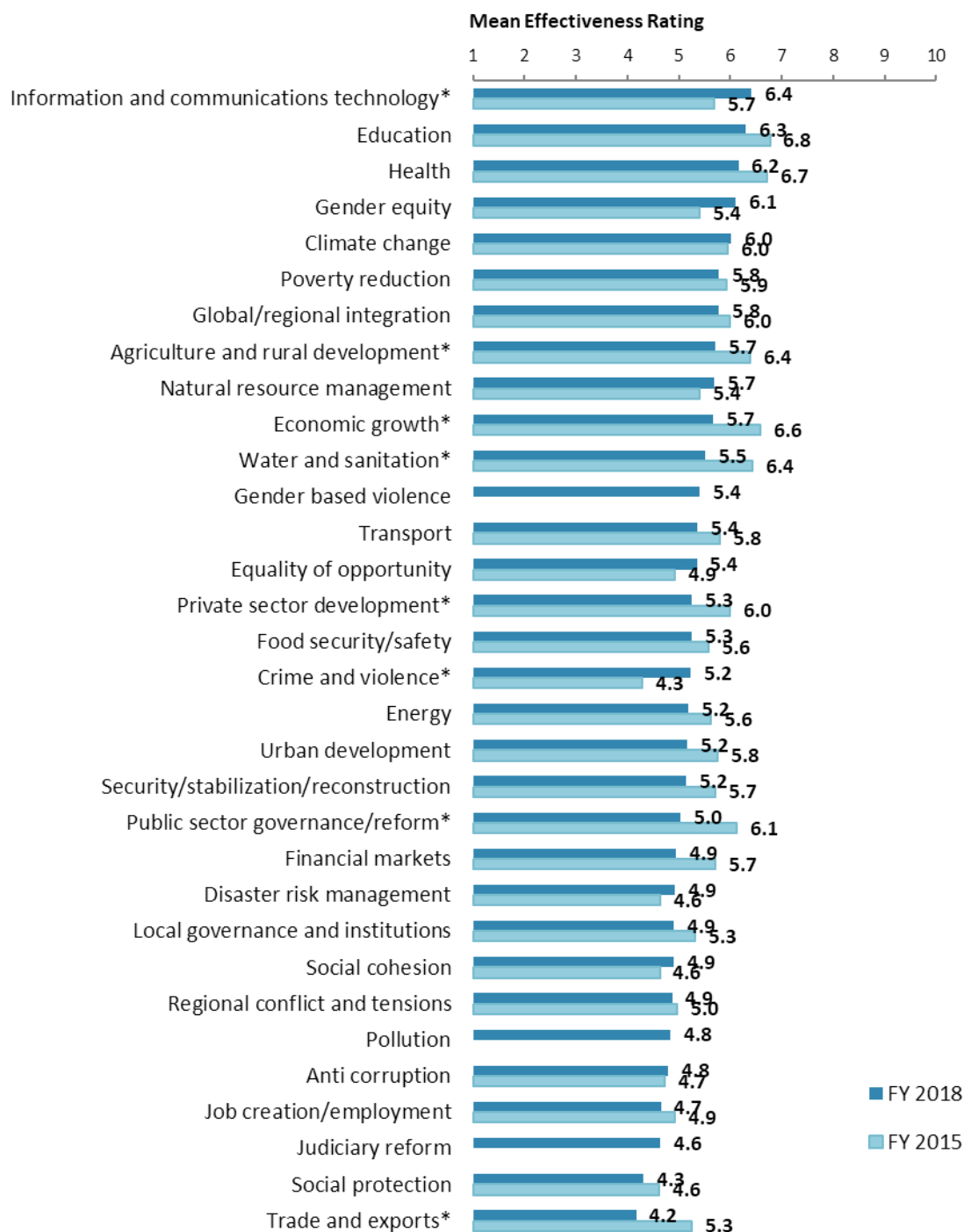


"Which of the following do you identify as the World Bank Group's greatest WEAKNESSES in its work in the Republic of Congo? (Choose no more than TWO)"

Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Year Comparison⁵



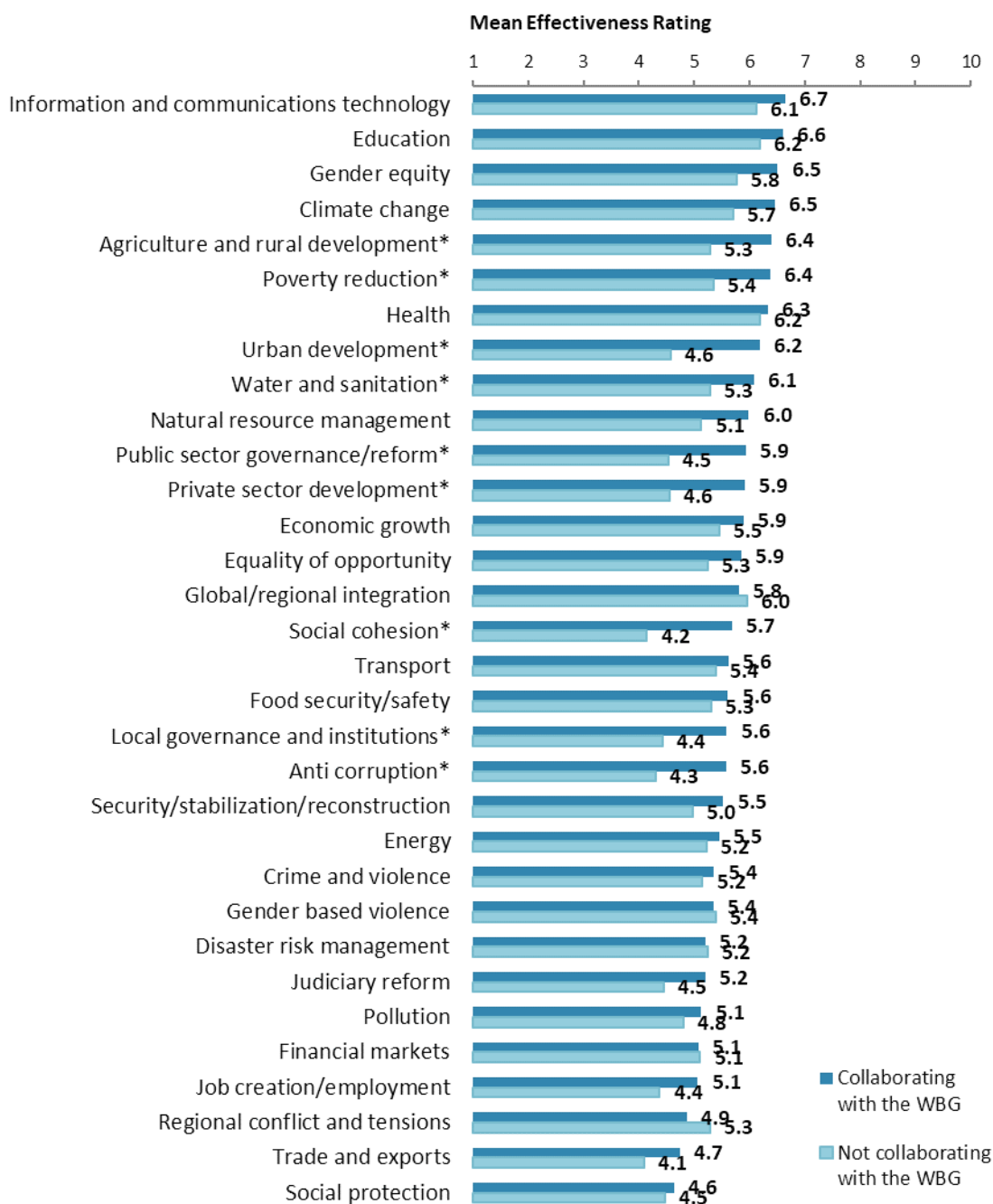

Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Collaboration⁶



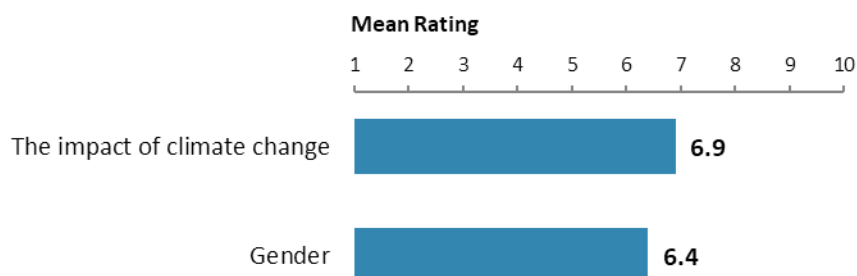

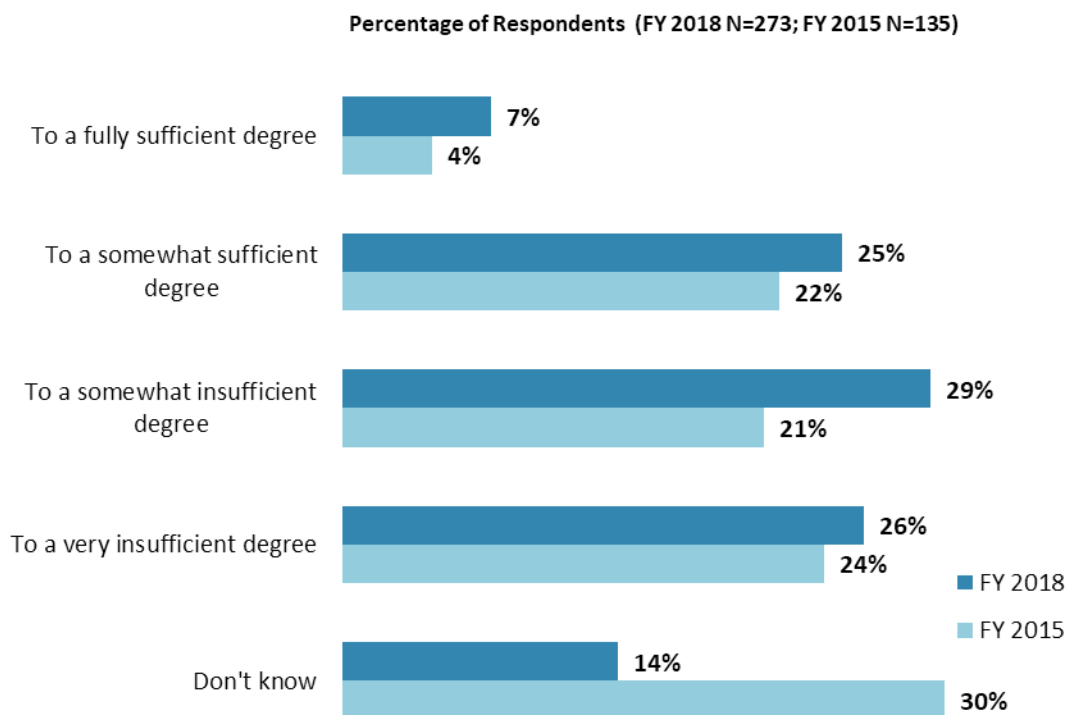

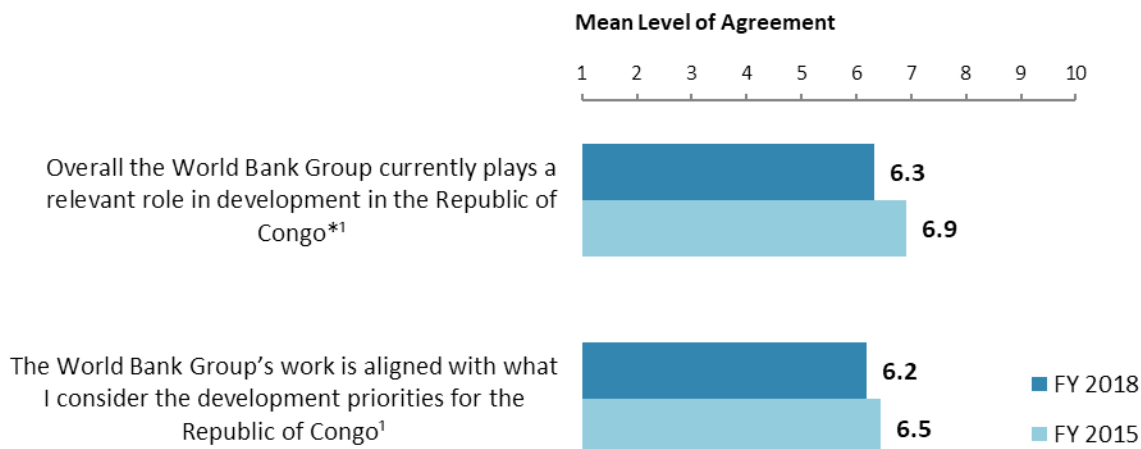
"To what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's work and support help the poorest in the Republic of Congo?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

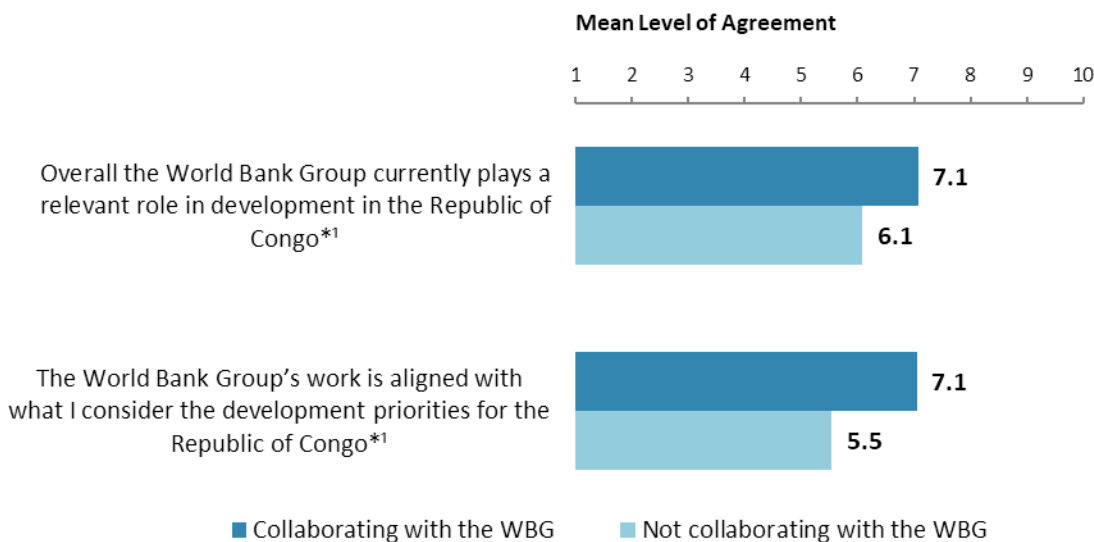

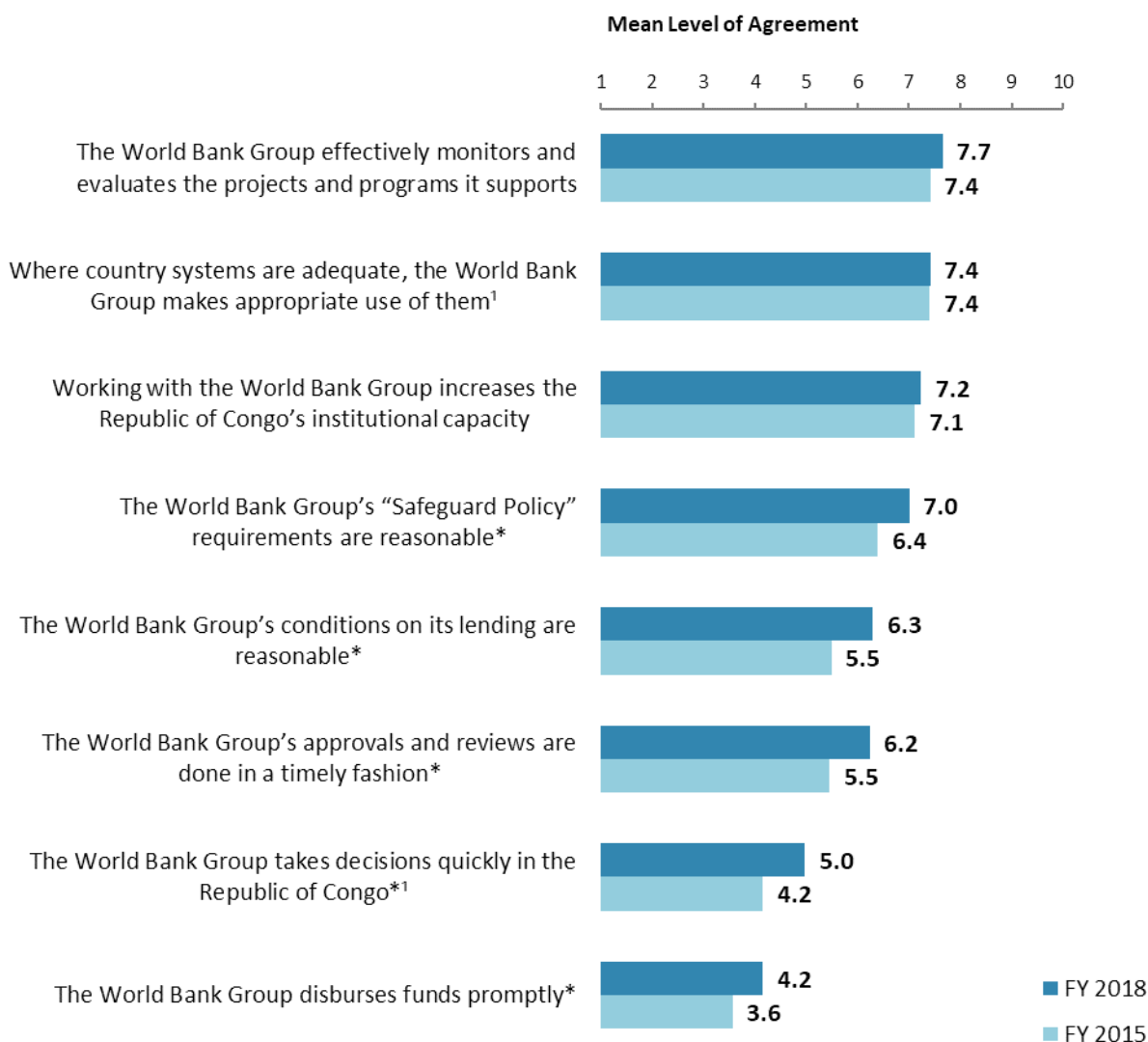

Overall Perceptions: Year Comparison⁹



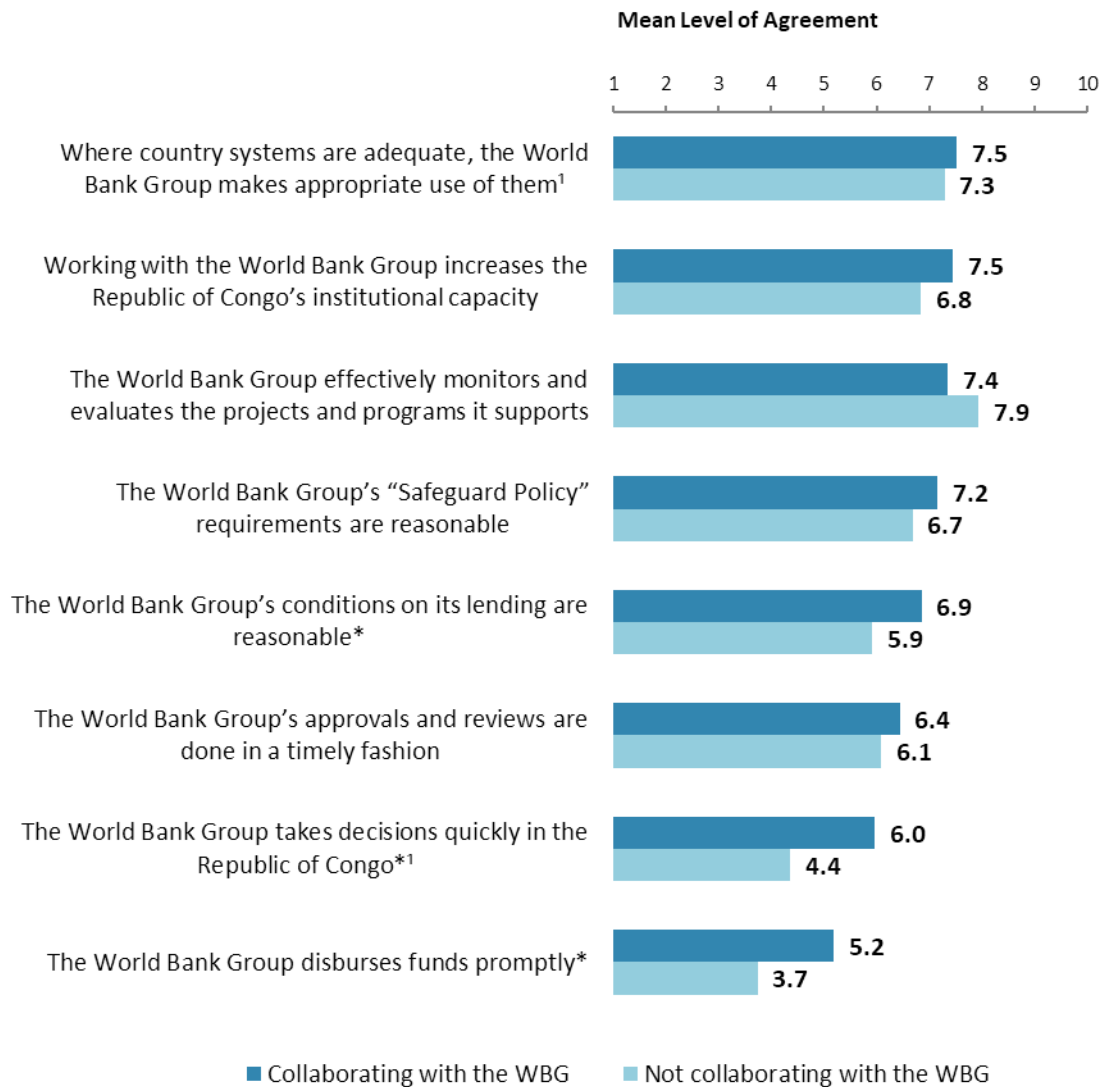

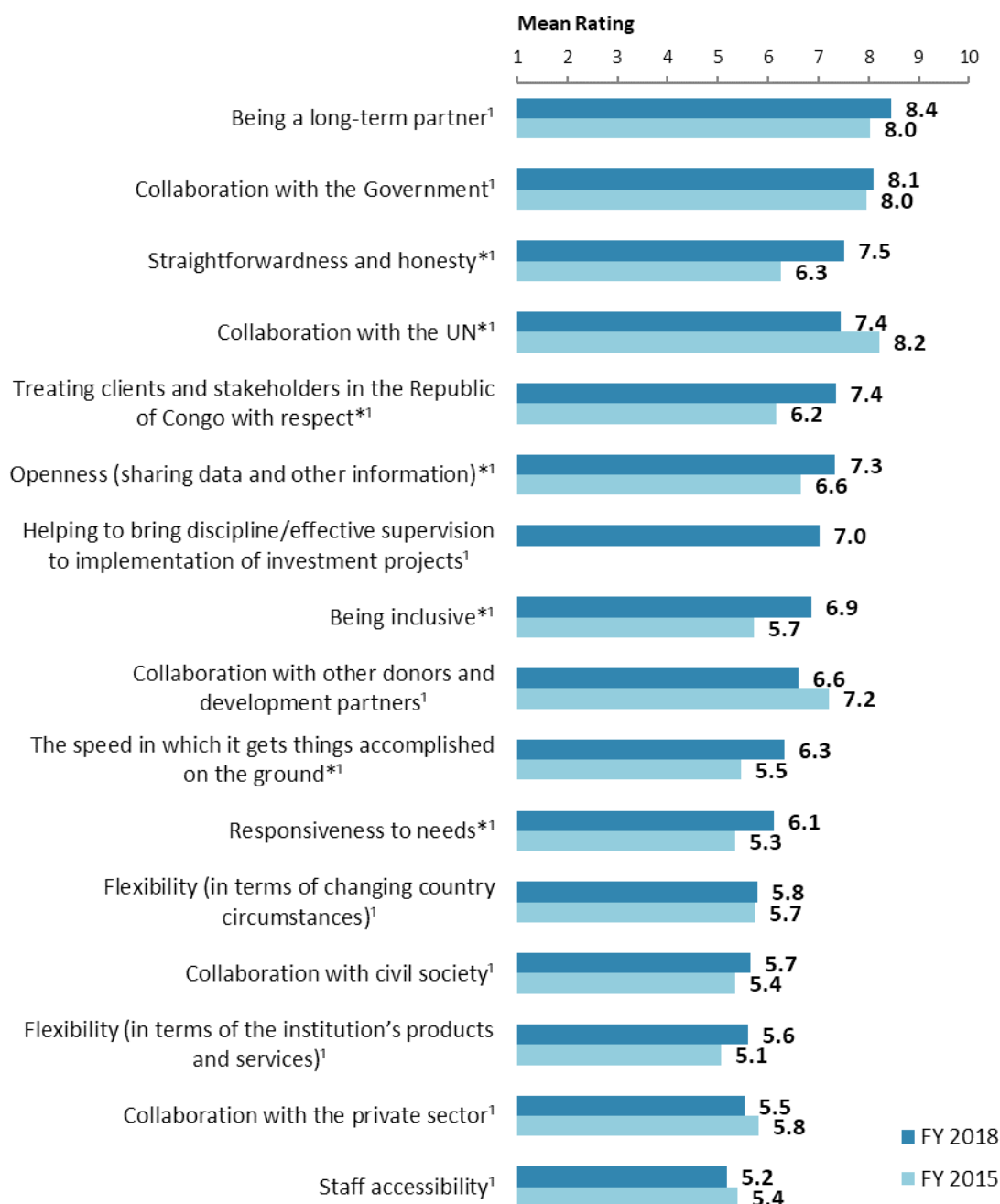

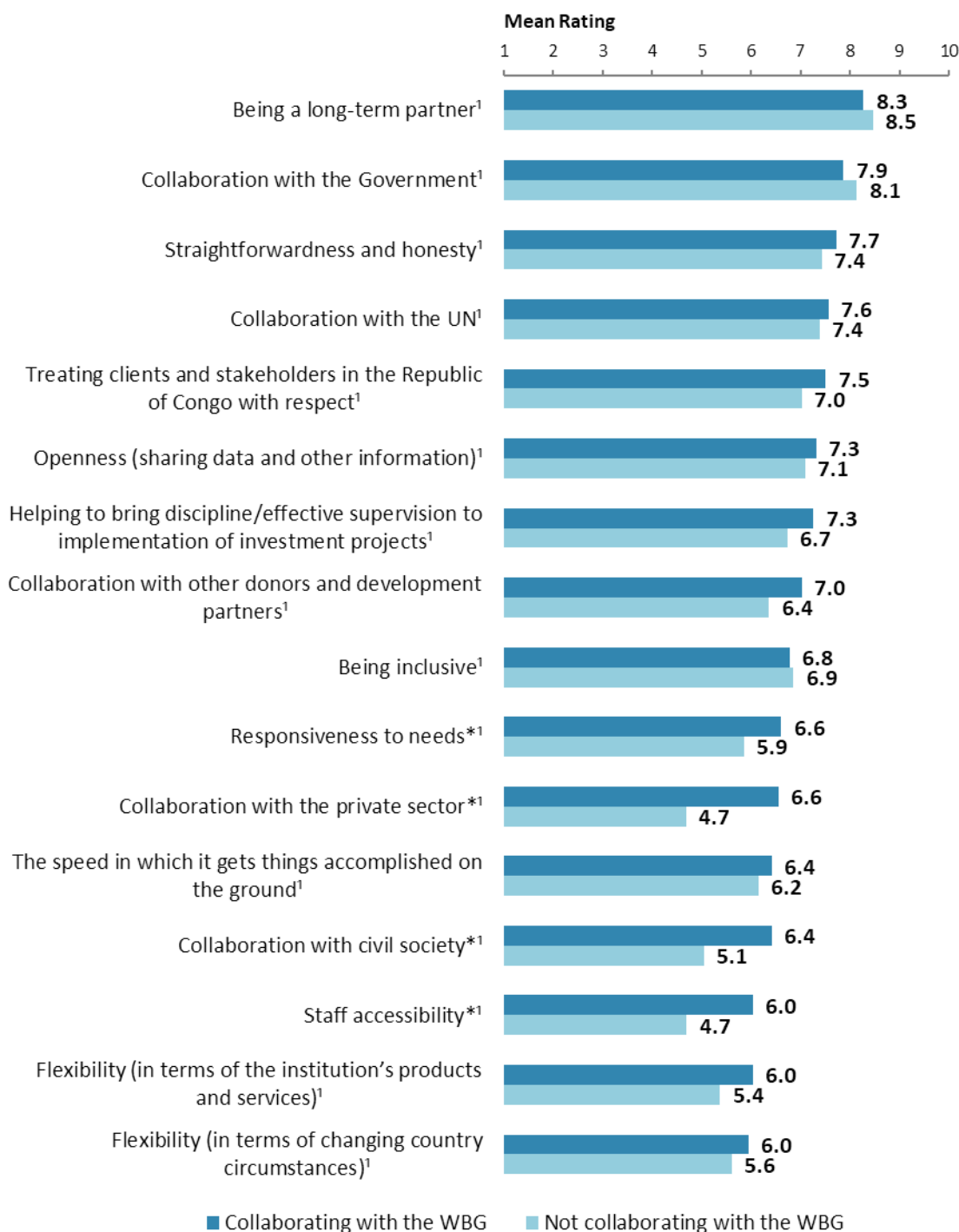

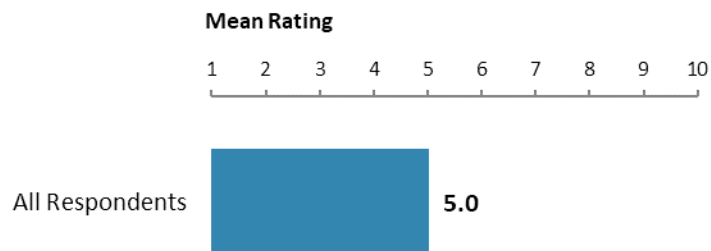

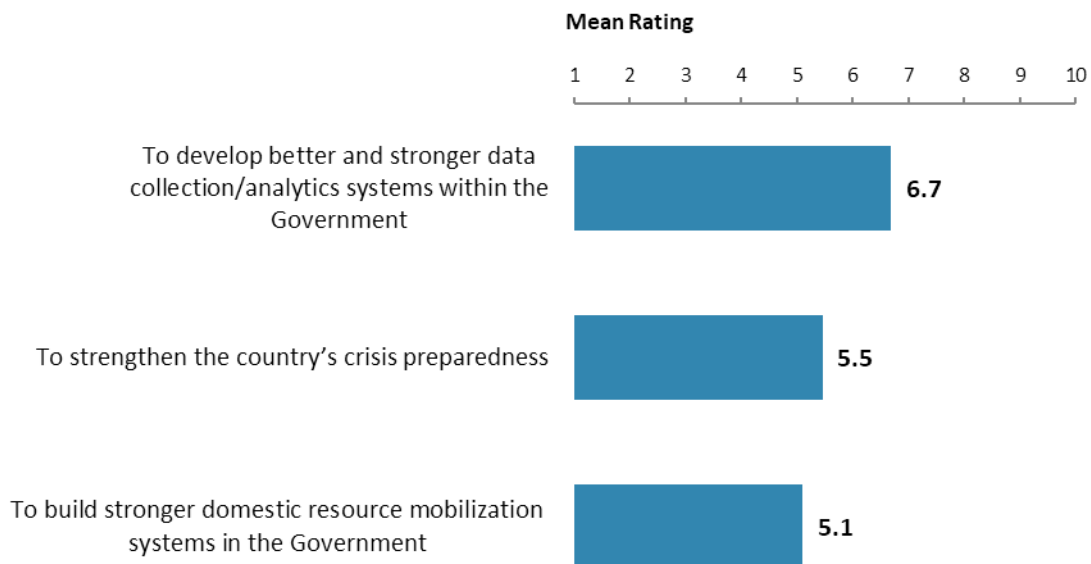

Effectiveness of WBG's Support



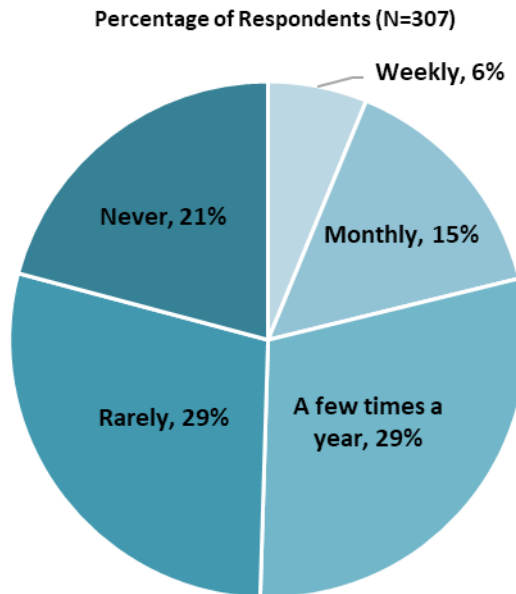
"How effectively does the World Bank Group support the Republic of Congo's efforts ... ?" (1-"Not effectively at all", 10-"Very effectively")

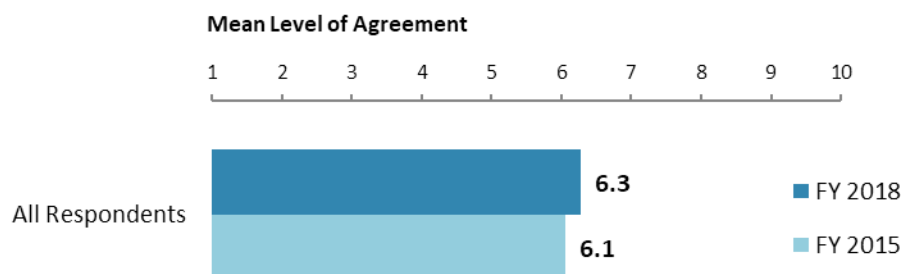


"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities in the work you do?" (Respondents chose from a list.)



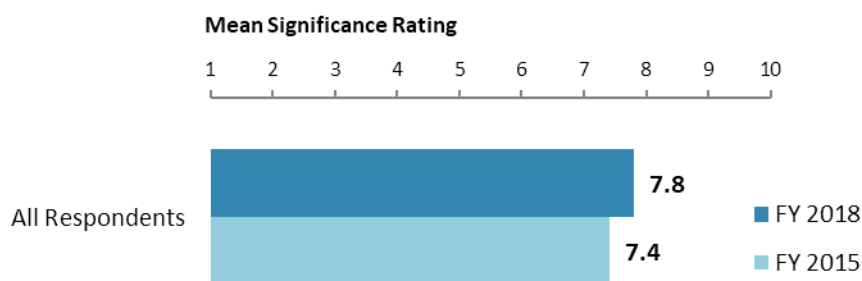

Meeting the Republic of Congo's Knowledge Needs¹¹ (*Indicator Question*)



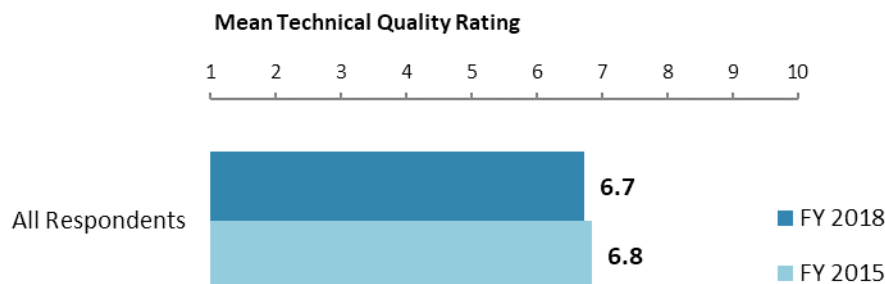

Technical Quality of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities (*Indicator Question*)



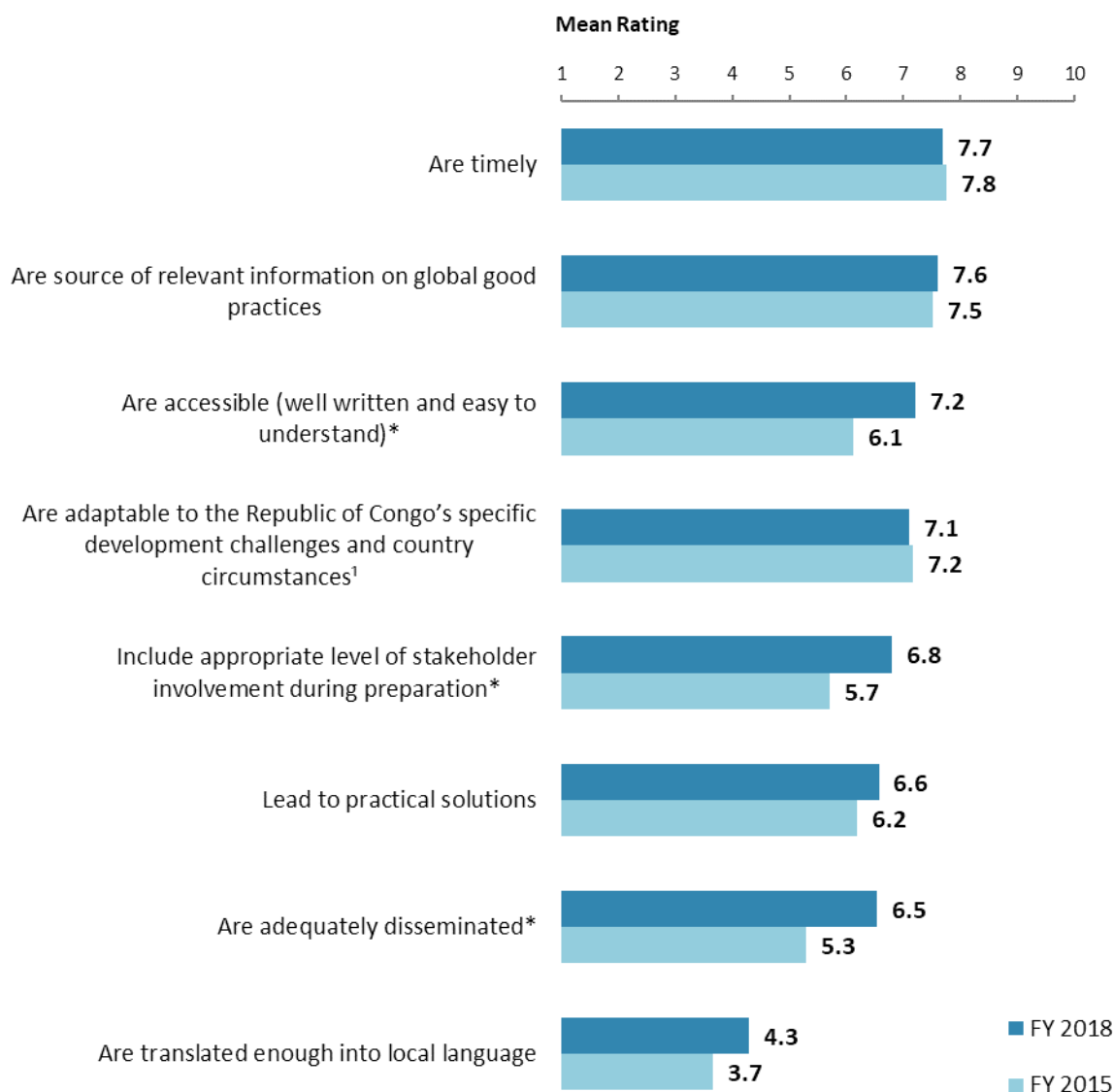

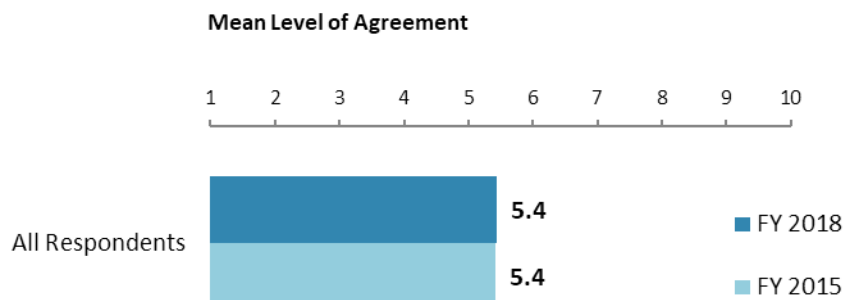

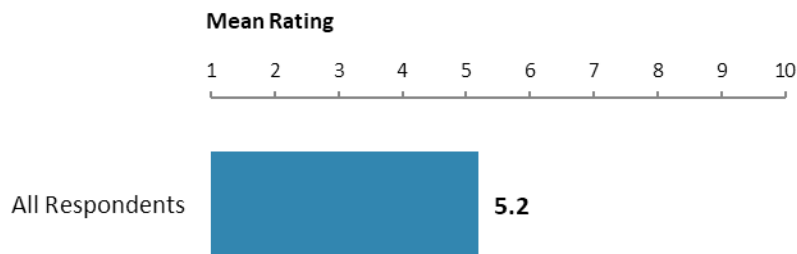

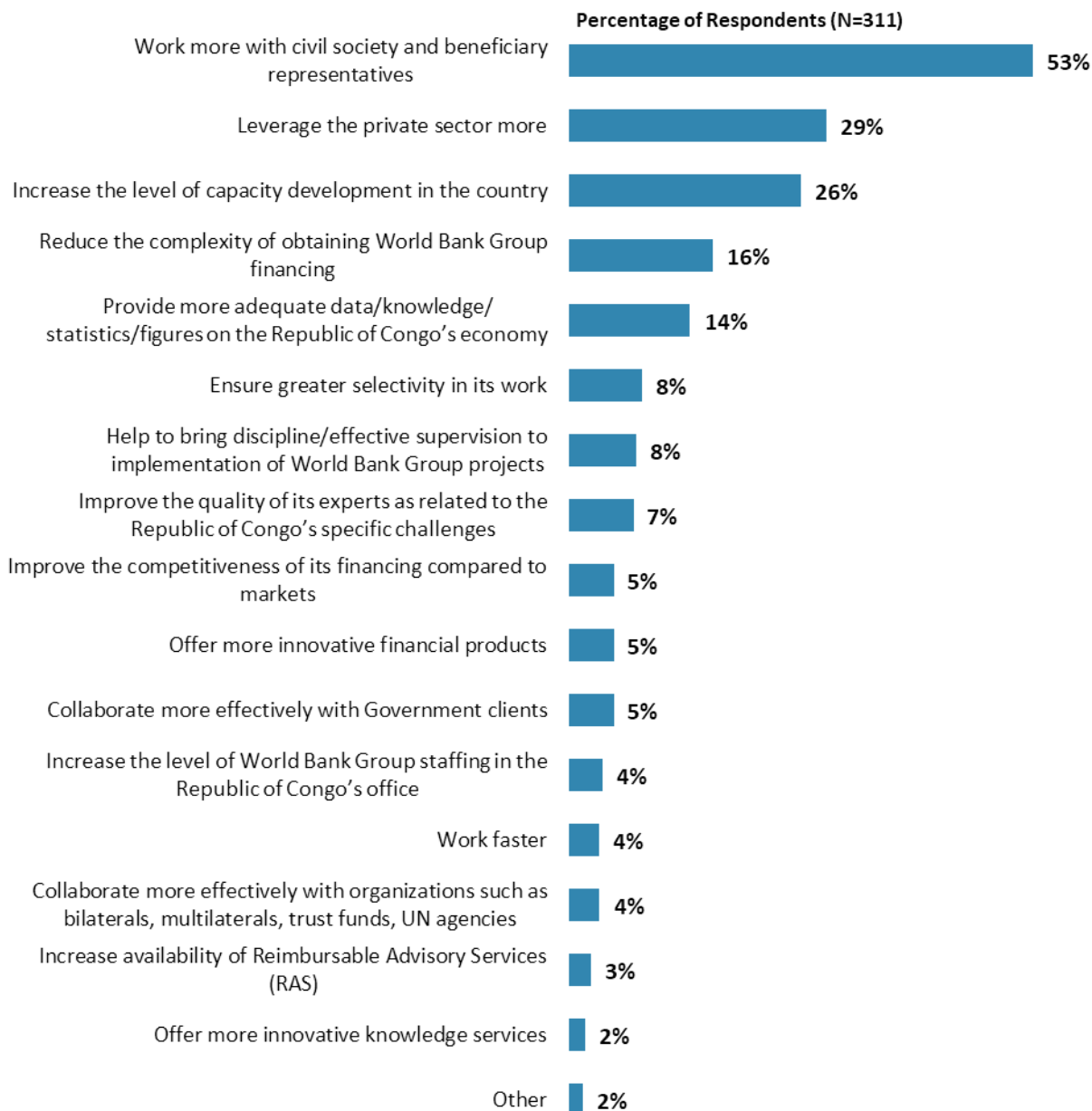

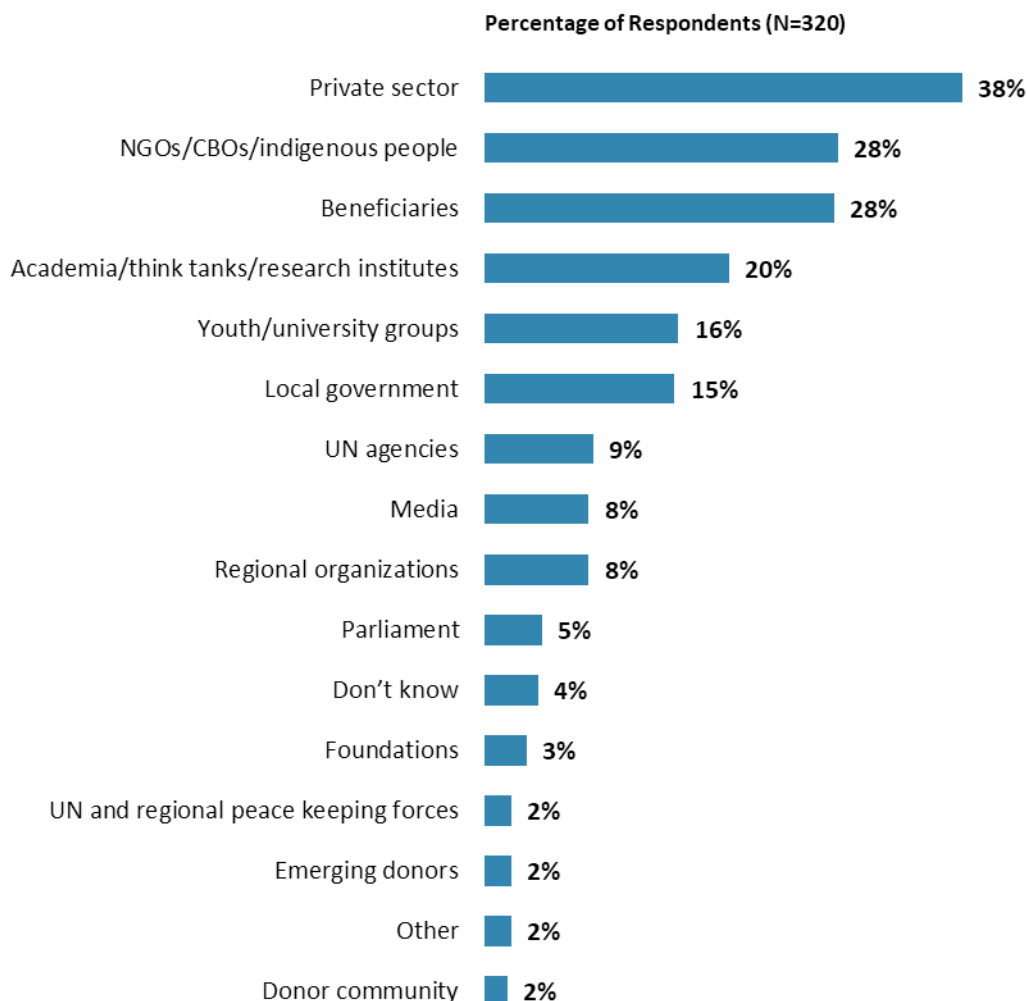

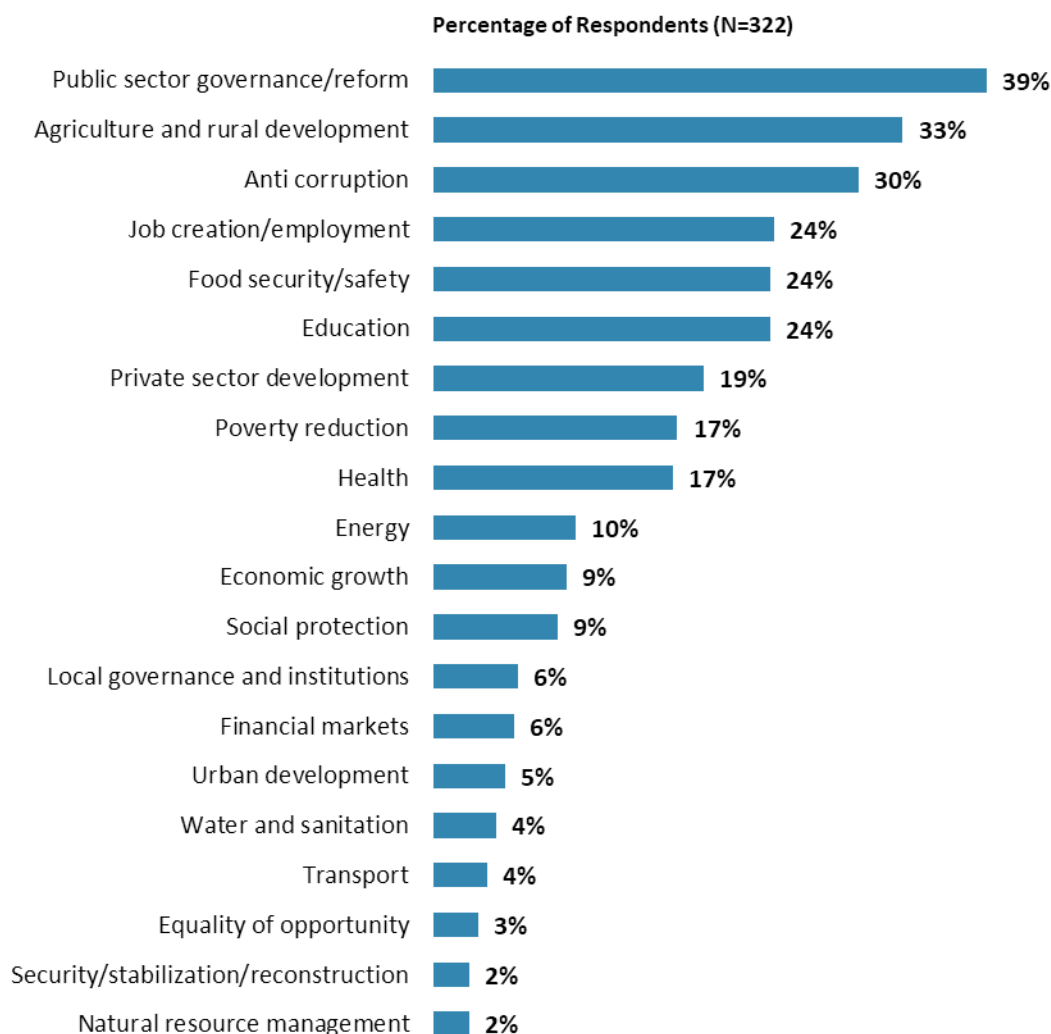

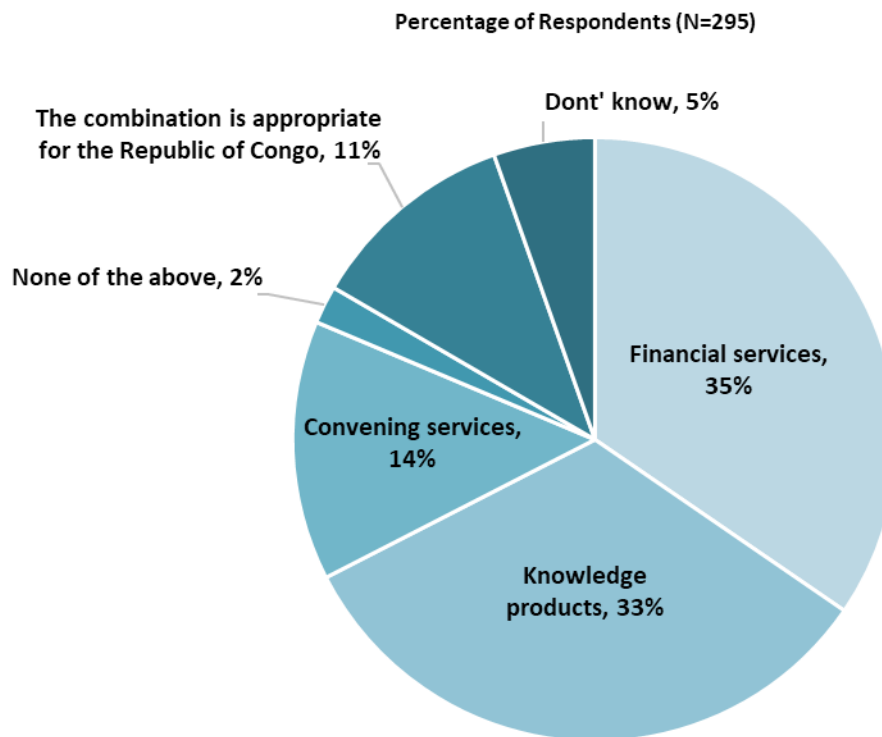

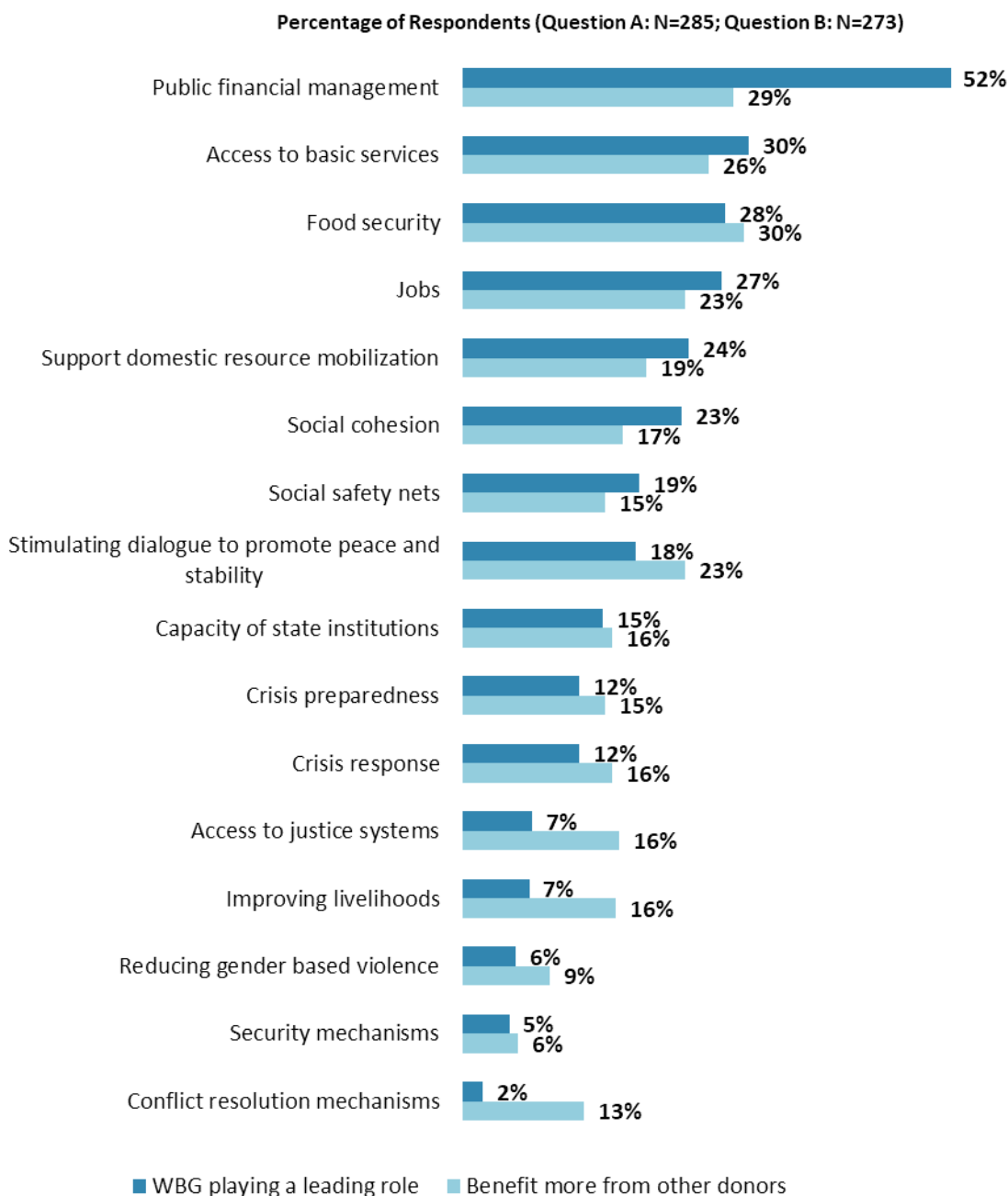

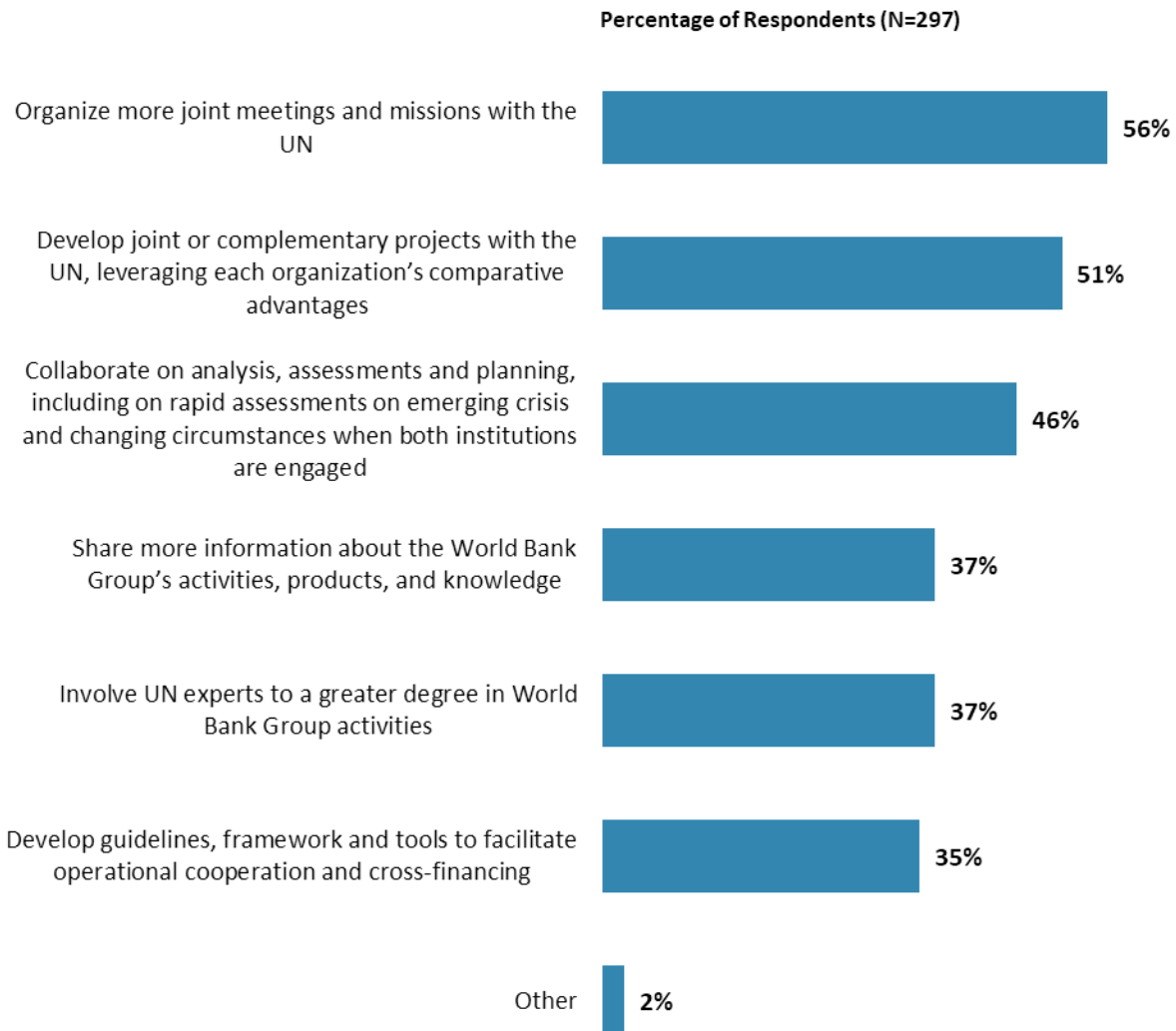

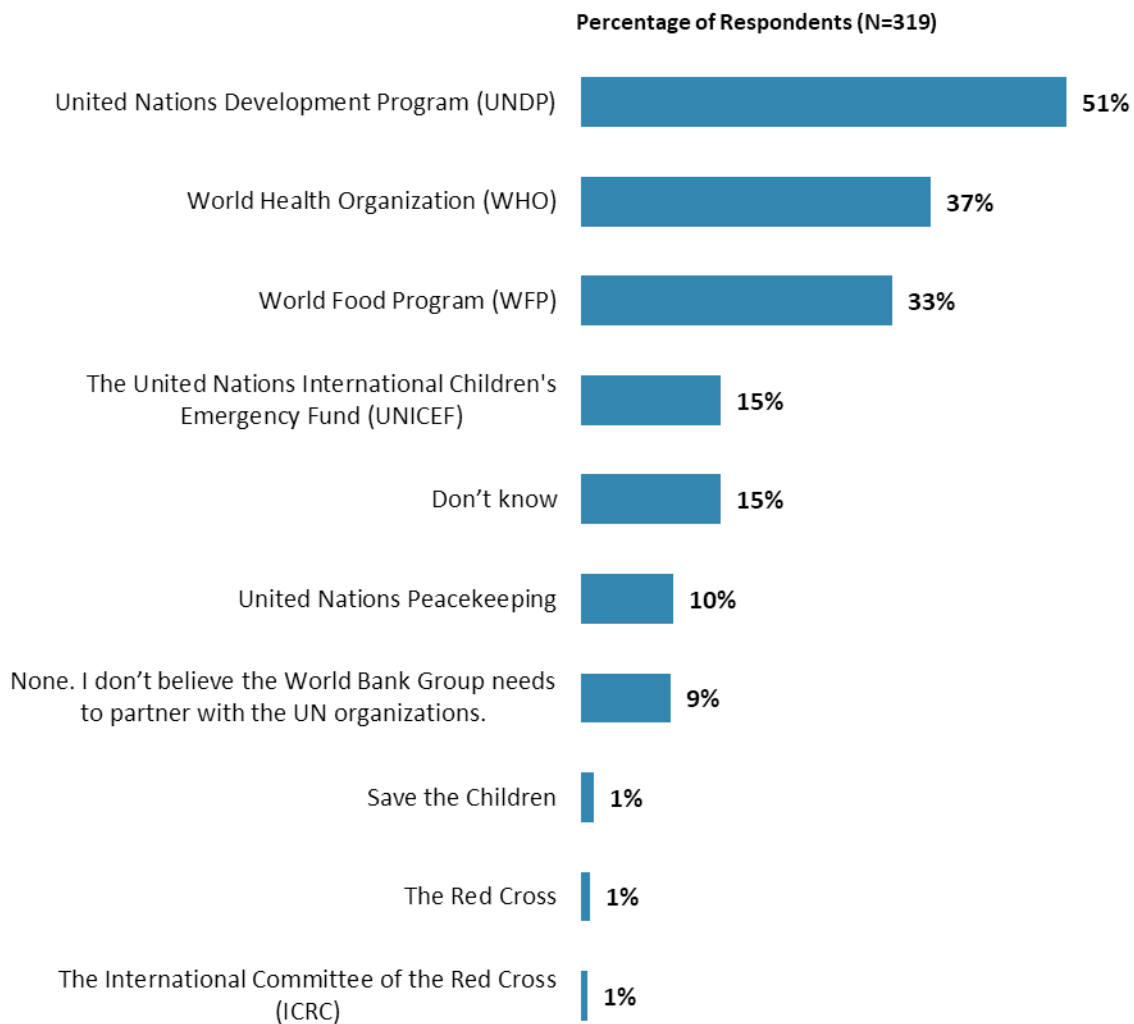


"What should the World Bank Group do to improve collaboration with the UN in the field?

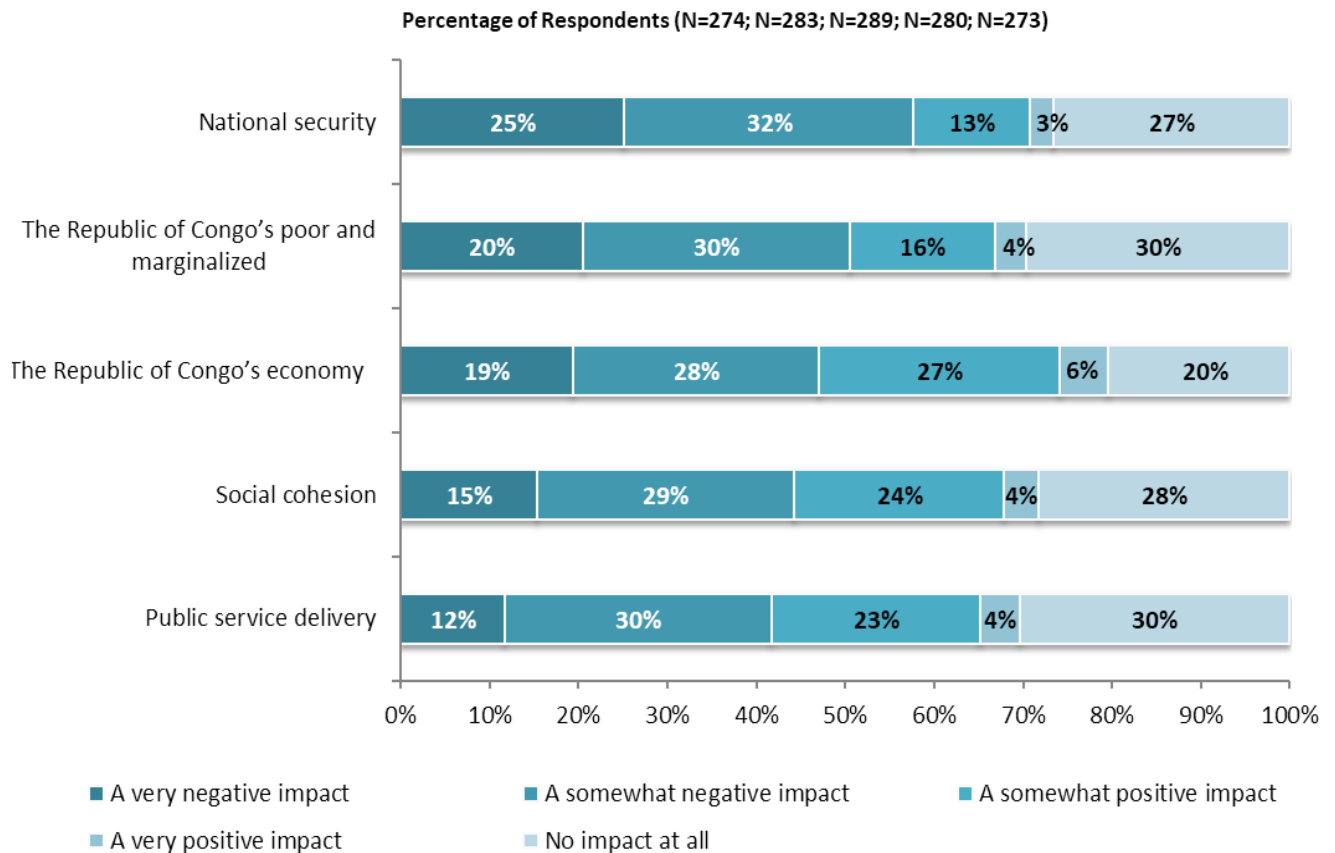

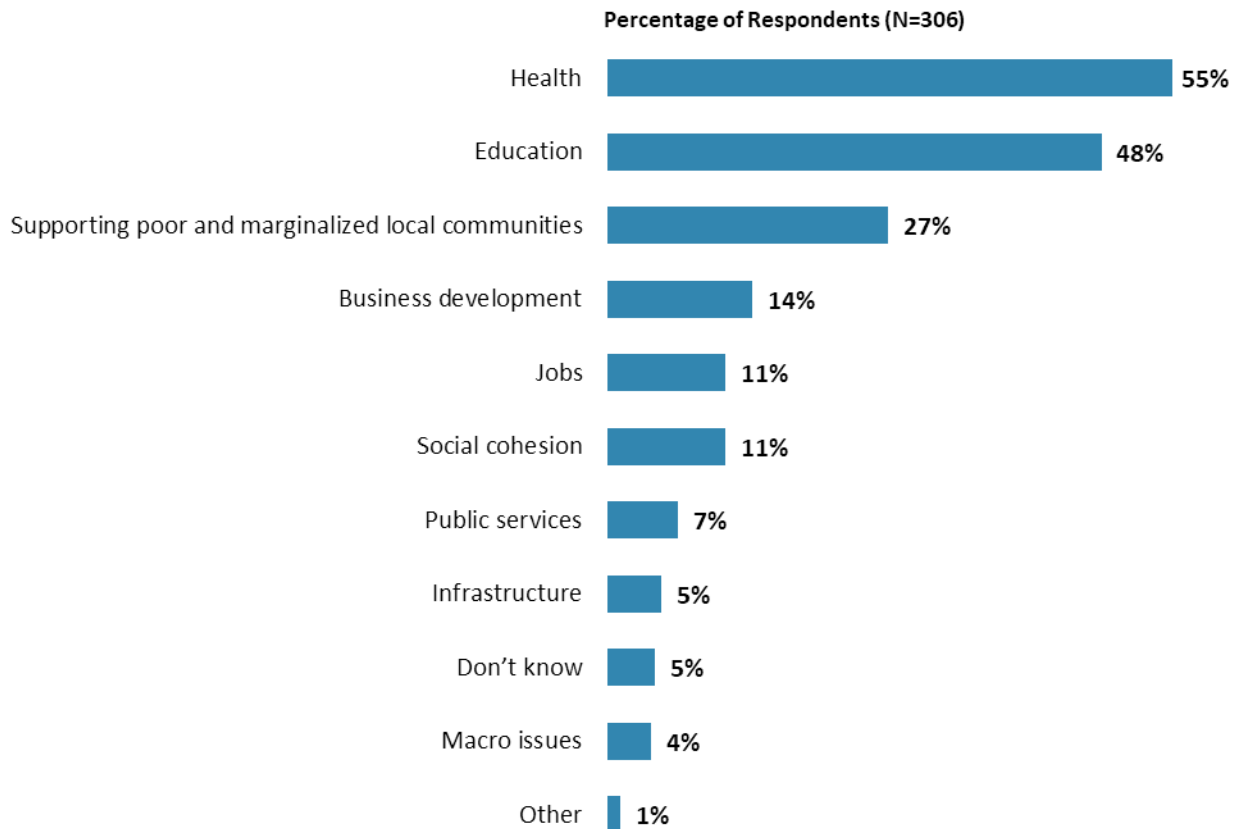

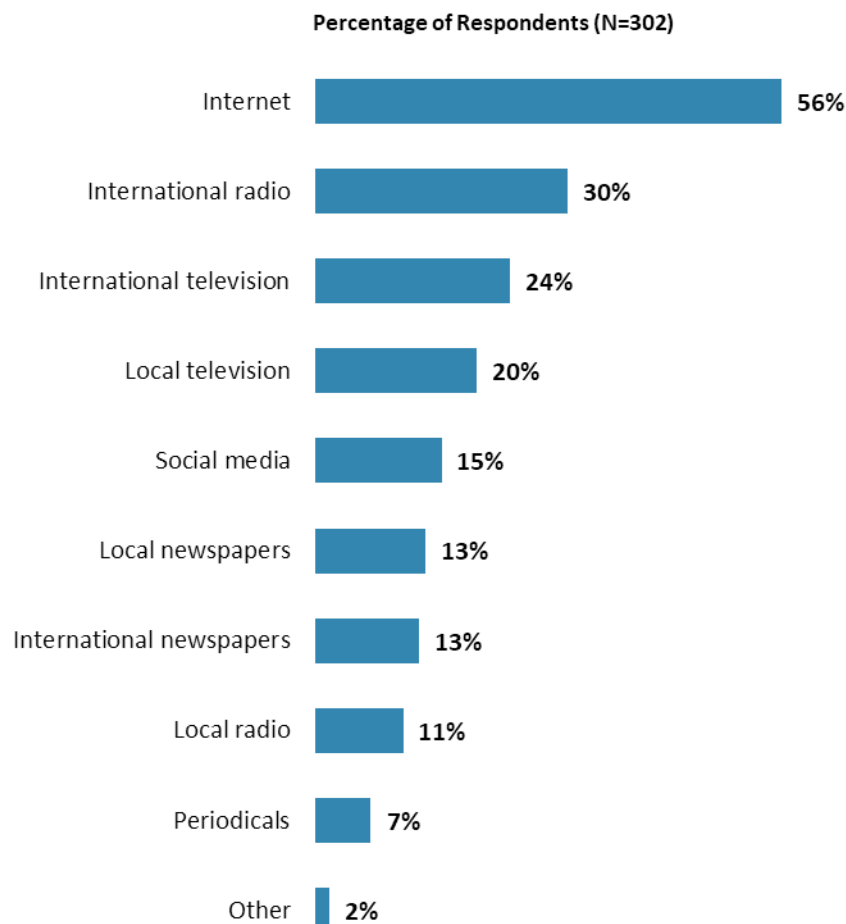

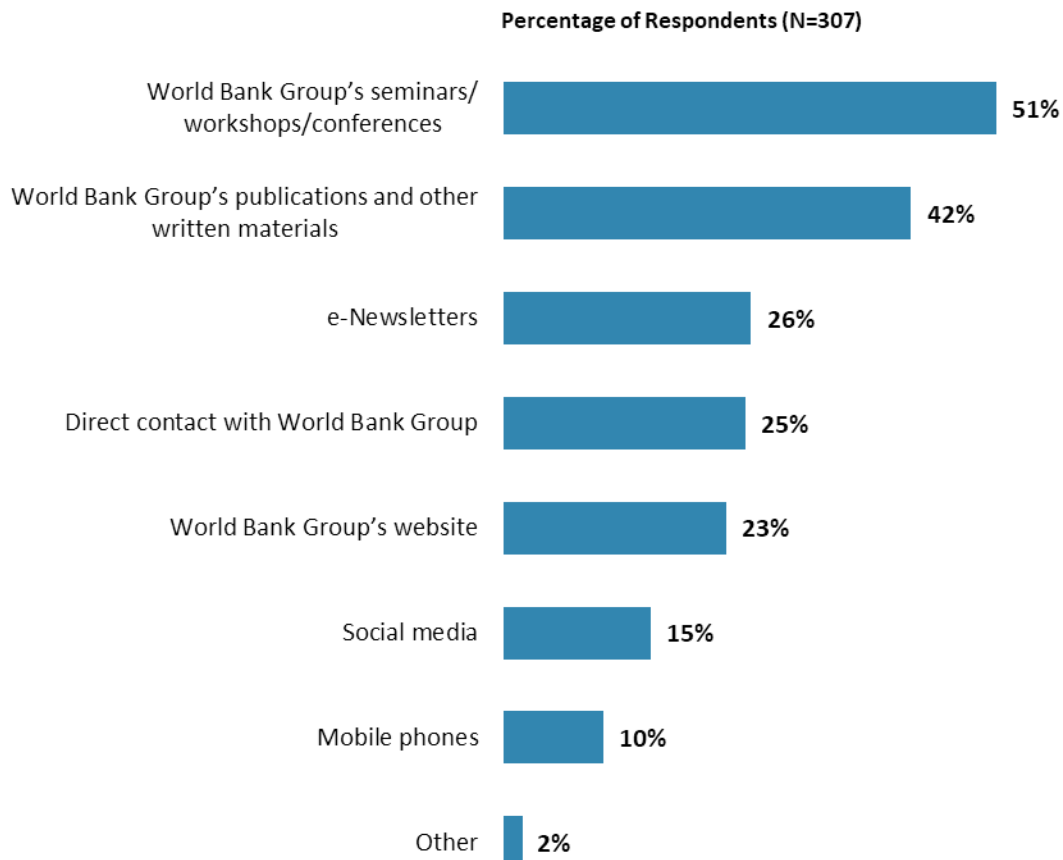
"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in the Republic of Congo? (Choose no more than TWO)"

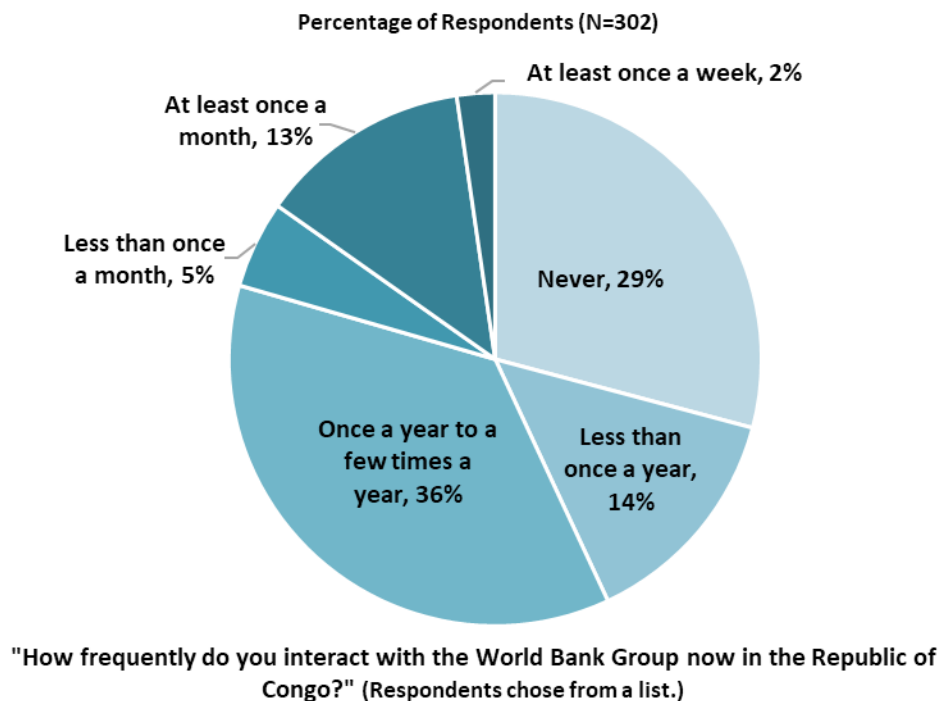


"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?
(Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

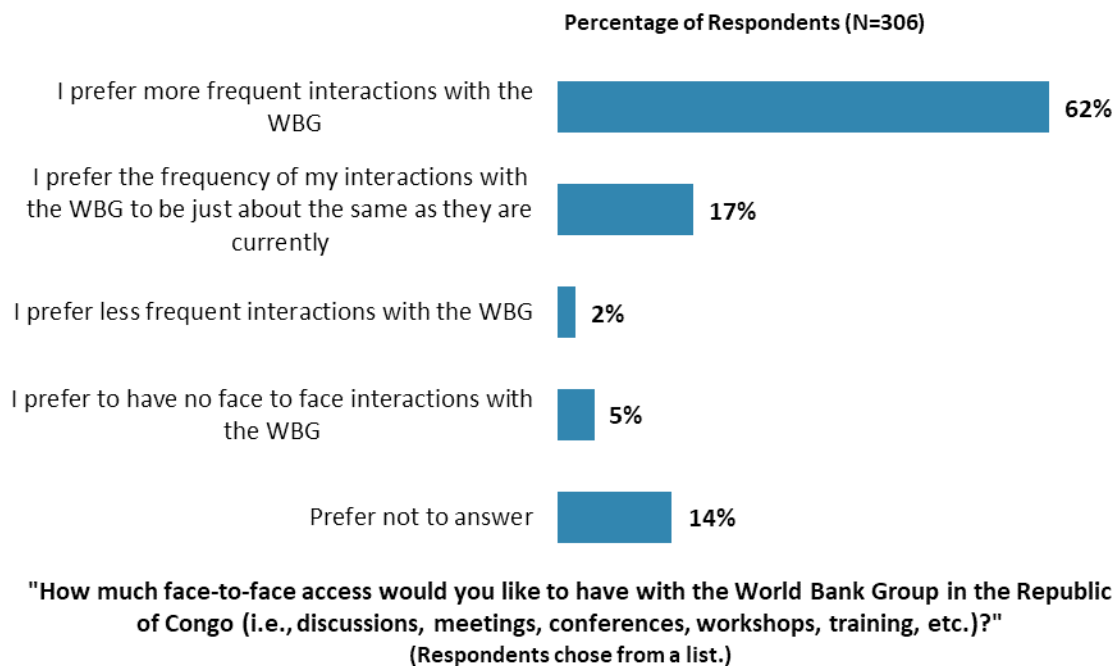

Face-to-Face Access to the WBG

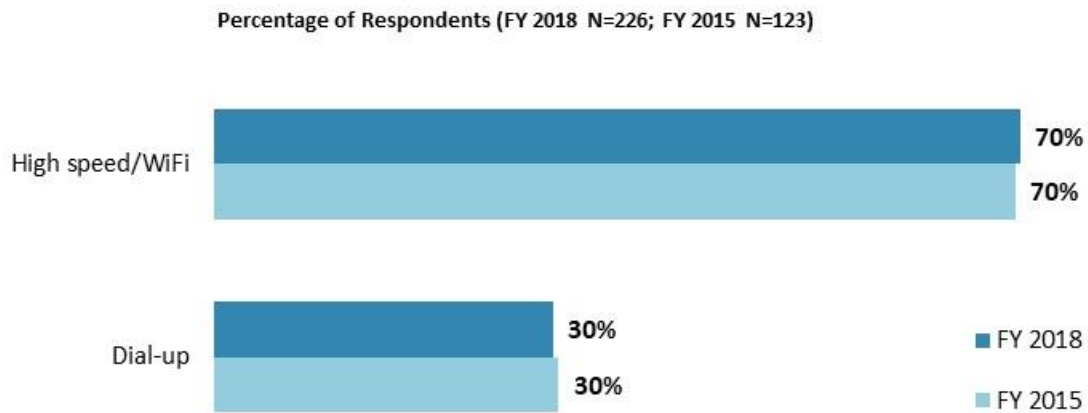

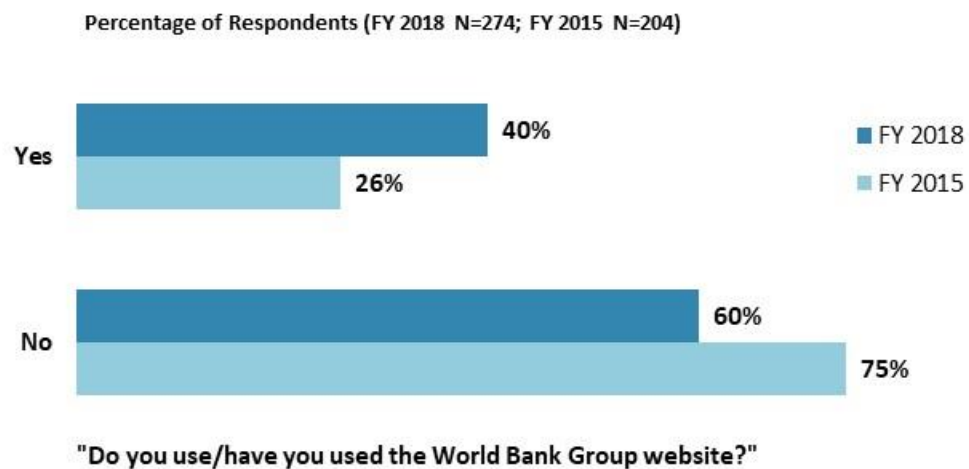
Access to the Internet¹⁴

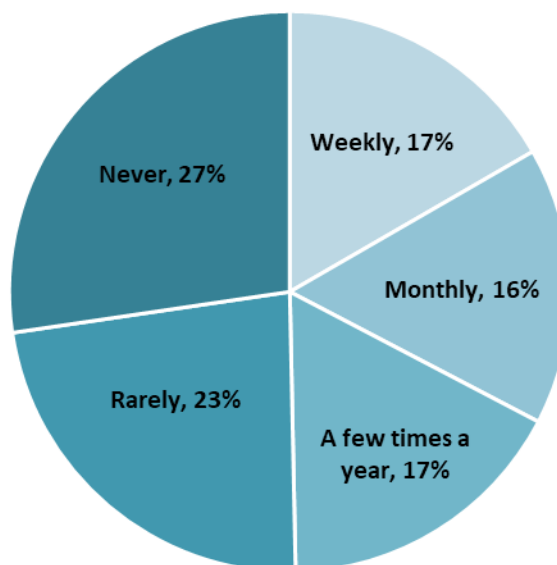
Percentage of Respondents (N=297)

Percentage of Respondents (N=300)



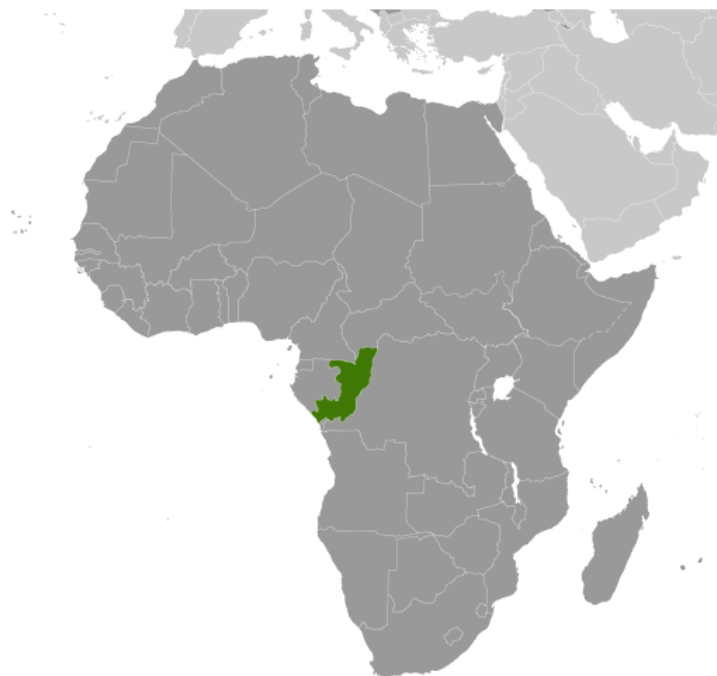
